Safety

Wear appropriate clothing for weather and activities. On the trail, bring water, map, compass, medication, food, first aid kit, whistle, and flashlight. Stay within your limits. Bring a buddy. Tell someone where you're going and when you'll be back. Return before dusk. On the water, always wear your life jacket.

Frequently Asked Questions

Can I bring my pet?

Yes, but pets must be on a leash no longer than 6 feet. Pet waste must be picked up and disposed properly.

Can I reserve the pavilion?

Yes, the picnic shelter may be reserved for a fee. Call 978-249-9150. When not reserved, it may be used by the general public for free.

What size motor is allowed on the lake?

10 HP maximum. Trolling motors may be used in lieu of larger motors.

Do I need to wear a life jacket?

We strongly recommend it. State law requires children under 12 to wear one and persons aboard a canoe or kayak from September 15 through May 15. Otherwise, a life jacket must be on board for each person.

Where can I swim?

There is no designated swimming area. Swimming is prohibited at the boat ramp, near the dam, and off-site at Doane's Falls. Otherwise, you may swim at your own risk.

Where can I camp?

Camping is only permitted on designated sites at the campground or off-site at the Tully Trail shelter near Royalston Falls.

Can I have a fire?

Fires are only allowed in designated campsite fire rings or picnic area grills.

Where can I ride my off-road vehicle?

There are no designated off-road vehicle trails. They are prohibited.

Can I hunt or fish?

Yes, hunting and fishing are allowed in accordance with state laws.
