The District Engineer has received a permit application to conduct work in waters of the United States from Francis J. Santos, FJ Santos Living Trust, 131A Commercial Street, Provincetown, Massachusetts. This work is proposed in Provincetown Harbor at 131A Commercial Street, Provincetown, Massachusetts. The site coordinates are: Latitude 042 02' 44.3118" N Longitude 070 11' 32.5005" W.

The work involves construction and maintenance of a 52' x 216' wharf with a 20' x 30' dock master's building, an 8' x 617' pier, a 5' x 40' ramp, to install 155 steel piles by pile driver and to relocate a 90 foot float system. The entire structure will extend approximately 985 feet beyond Mean High Water (MHW).

The purpose of this work is to gain access to deeper water and to prevent existing floats from bottoming out.

The work is shown on the attached plans entitled "APPLICATION BY: FJ SANTOS LIVING TRUST, 131 A COMMERCIAL STREET PURPOSE: TO LICENSE AND MAINTIAN A PROPOSED WHARF, PIER RAMP AND FLOAT SYSTEM IN PROVINCETOWN HARBOR, BARNSTABLE COUNTY, MA" on thirteen sheets, and dated "JUNE 8, 2017"

#### **AUTHORITY**

Permits are required pursuant to:	
_X_Section 10 of the Rivers and Harbors Act of 1899	
Section 404 of the Clean Water Act

The decision whether to issue a permit will be based on an evaluation of the probable impact of the proposed activity on the public interest. That decision will reflect the national concern for both protection and utilization of important resources. The benefit which may reasonably accrue from the proposal must be balanced against its reasonably foreseeable detriments. All factors which may be relevant to the proposal will be considered, including the cumulative effects thereof; among those are: conservation, economics, aesthetics, general environmental concerns, wetlands, cultural value, fish and wildlife values, flood hazards, flood plain value, land use, navigation, shoreline erosion and accretion, recreation, water supply and conservation, water quality, energy needs, safety, food production and, in general, the needs and welfare of the people.

The Corps of Engineers is soliciting comments from the public; Federal, state, and local agencies and officials; Indian Tribes; and other interested parties in order to consider and evaluate the impacts of this proposed activity. Any comments received will be considered by the Corps of Engineers to determine whether to issue, modify, condition or deny a permit for this proposal. To make this decision, comments are used to assess impacts on endangered species, historic properties, water quality, general environmental effects, and the other public interest factors listed above. Comments are used in the preparation of an Environmental Assessment and/or an Environmental Impact Statement pursuant to the National Environmental Policy Act. Comments are also used to determine the need for a public hearing and to determine the overall public interest of the proposed activity.

#### **ESSENTIAL FISH HABITAT**

The Magnuson-Stevens Fishery Conservation and Management Act, as amended by the Sustainable Fisheries Act of 1996 (Public Law 104-267), requires all federal agencies to consult with the National Marine Fisheries Service on all actions, or proposed actions, permitted, funded, or undertaken by the agency, that may adversely affect Essential Fish Habitat (EFH).

This project will impact <u>0.40</u> acres of Essential Fish Habitat (*EFH*) for those species listed on the table below). This habitat consists of fine sand. Loss of this habitat may adversely affect (name species, provide a brief description of impact to habitat or species and any anticipated mitigation). However, the District Engineer has made a preliminary determination that the site-specific adverse effect will not be substantial. Further consultation with the National Marine Fisheries Service regarding EFH conservation recommendations is being conducted and will be concluded prior to the final decision.

### NATIONAL HISTORIC PRESERVATION ACT

Based on his initial review, the District Engineer has determined that little likelihood exists for the proposed work to impinge upon properties with cultural or Native American significance, or listed in, or eligible for listing in, the National Register of Historic Places. Therefore, no further consideration of the requirements of Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act of 1966, as amended, is necessary. This determination is based upon one or more of the following:

- a. The permit area has been extensively modified by previous work.
- b. The permit area has been recently created.
- c. The proposed activity is of limited nature and scope.
- d. Review of the latest published version of the National Register shows that no presence of registered properties listed as being eligible for inclusion therein are in the permit area or general vicinity.
- e. Coordination with the State Historic Preservation Officer and/or Tribal Historic Preservation Officer(s)

# **ENDANGERED SPECIES CONSULTATION**

The initial determinations made herein will be reviewed in light of facts submitted in response to this notice. All comments will be considered a matter of public record. Copies of letters of objection will be forwarded to the applicant who will normally be requested to contact objectors directly in an effort to reach an understanding.




PROFILE PLAN

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
