The District Engineer has received a permit application to conduct work in waters of the United States as described below.

**APPLICANT:** Sprite Island Yacht Club

**ACTIVITY:** Sprite Island Yacht Club proposed to retain and maintain an existing 24 acre mooring field and associated piers used for seasonal and recreational boating activities.

A detailed description and plans of the activity are attached.

#### WATERWAY AND LOCATION OF THE PROPOSED WORK:

This work is proposed in Long Island sound approximately 0.20 miles offshore from Shorehaven Road in East Norwalk, Connecticut. The State Plane Coordinates for the mooring field boundary are listed below.

The decision whether to issue a permit will be based on an evaluation of the probable impact of the proposed activity on the public interest. That decision will reflect the national concern for both protection and utilization of important resources. The benefit which may reasonably accrue from the proposal must be balanced against its reasonably foreseeable detriments. All factors which may be relevant to the proposal will be considered, including the cumulative effects thereof; among those are: conservation, economics, aesthetics, general environmental concerns, wetlands, cultural value, fish and wildlife values, flood hazards, flood plain value, land use, navigation, shoreline erosion and accretion, recreation, water supply and conservation, water quality, energy needs, safety, food production and, in general, the needs and welfare of the people.

The Corps of Engineers is soliciting comments from the public; Federal, state, and local agencies and officials; Indian Tribes; and other interested parties in order to consider and evaluate the impacts of this proposed activity. Any comments received will be considered by the Corps of Engineers to determine whether to issue, modify, condition or deny a permit for this proposal. To make this decision, comments are used to assess impacts on endangered species, historic properties, water quality, general environmental effects, and the other public interest factors listed above. Comments are used in the preparation of an Environmental Assessment and/or an Environmental Impact Statement pursuant to the National Environmental Policy Act. Comments are also used to determine the need for a public hearing and to determine the overall public interest of the proposed activity.

#### **ESSENTIAL FISH HABITAT:**

The Magnuson-Stevens Fishery Conservation and Management Act, as amended by the Sustainable Fisheries Act of 1996 (Public Law 104-267), requires all federal agencies to consult with the National Marine Fisheries Service on all actions, or proposed actions, permitted, funded, or undertaken by the agency, that may adversely affect Essential Fish Habitat (EFH).

This project will impact approximately 25 acres of Essential Fish Habitat (EFH) for the species shown on the attached Summary of Essential Fish Habitat Designation. Loss of this habitat may adversely affect the species described in said summary. However, the District Engineer has made a preliminary determination that the site-specific adverse effect will not be substantial. Further consultation with the National Marine Fisheries Service regarding EFH conservation recommendations is being conducted and will be concluded prior to the final decision.

Based on his initial review, the District Engineer has determined that little likelihood exists for the proposed work to impinge upon properties with cultural or Native American significance, or listed in, or eligible for listing in, the National Register of Historic Places. Therefore, no further consideration of the requirements of Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act of 1966, as amended, is necessary. This determination is based upon one or more of the following:

- a. The permit area has been extensively modified by previous work.
- b. The permit area has been recently created.
- c. The proposed activity is of limited nature and scope.
- d. Review of the latest published version of the National Register shows that no presence of registered properties listed as being eligible for inclusion therein are in the permit area or general vicinity.
- e. Coordination with the State Historic Preservation Officer and/or Tribal Historic Preservation Officer(s)

#### ENDANGERED SPECIES CONSULTATION

The New England District, Army Corps of Engineers has reviewed the list of species protected under the Endangered Species Act of 1973, as amended, which might occur at the project site. It is our preliminary determination that the proposed activity for which authorization is being sought is designed, situated or will be operated/used in such a manner that it is not likely to adversely affect any Federally listed endangered or threatened species or their designated critical habitat. By this Public Notice, we are requesting that the appropriate Federal Agency concur with our determination.

The States of Connecticut, Maine, Massachusetts, New Hampshire and Rhode Island have approved **Coastal Zone Management Programs**. Where applicable the applicant states that any proposed activity will comply with and will be conducted in a manner that is consistent with the approved Coastal Zone Management Program. By this Public Notice, we are requesting the State concurrence or objection to the applicant's consistency statement.

#### PROPOSED WORK AND PURPOSE

Sprite Island Yacht Club is seeking formal authorization for a 24 acre seasonal mooring field, which includes up to 85 moorings in Long Island Sound, immediately west of Sprite Island in East Norwalk, Connecticut. The applicant has previously maintained a yacht club and mooring field at this location for recreational boating purposes since 1970. The mooring field however, as it has been configured since 2008, has not been authorized.

In addition to the proposed mooring field, the project will also include the retention of following existing structures:

- 4' x 92' pier
   2'6" x 22' ramp
   12' x 15' floating dock
   6' x 95' floating dock
- 2. 5' x 91' wooden pier
  3' x 26' ramp
  9.5' x 22' floating dock
  (10) 6' x 10.2' floating docks

The work is described on the enclosed plans entitled "Sprite Island Yacht Club Shorehaven Road, East Norwalk, CT," on five sheets dated "10/27/2011."






