PERFORMANCE WORK STATEMENT

Gym Equipment Maintenance & Repair Performance Work Statement

A. GENERAL

- 1. Scope The contractor must furnish all labor, materials, and equipment necessary to provide preventative maintenance service to all strength and cardio equipment located in the Concord Park Fitness Center located at 696 Virginia Rd, Concord, Massachusetts. The scopeincludes inspection of parts for wear and misalignment, maintenance cleaning/lubricating, and replacement of worn or damage parts to maintain the operational status of the equipment. All repairs shall be made onsite. Services are to be provided in accordance with the following scope of work and schedule. Contractor is responsible for, but not be limited to, all job planning, scheduling, administration, inspection, personnel, equipment, vehicles, materials, supplies, supervision, and quality control necessary to perform the various services required herein.
- 2. **Location** U.S. Army Corps of Engineers Headquarters Office, 696 Virginia Road, Concord, Massachusetts 01742.
- 3. **Site Visit** Contact the Technical Point Sheila Harvey (978-318-8504, Sheila. Harvey@usace.army.mil to arrange a site visit.
- 4. **Schedule** The period of performance shall be from 1 October 2024 to 30 September 2025. In addition, the Government may exercise two (2) optional years with the same scope of services. Option year one (1) would include a period of performance from 1 October 2025 through 30 September 2026. Option year two (2) would include a period of performance from 1 October 2026 through 30 September 2027.

No Inspection and Maintenance Service will be done on Saturdays, Sundays, and holidays unless approved inadvance by the Technical Point of Contact.

- 6. **Other Contracts** The Government may undertake or award other contracts for additionalwork not related to this contract, and the Contractor shall fully cooperate with other Contractors and Government employees. The contractor shall not commit or permit any act, which will interfere with the performance of work by another contractor, or by Government employees.
- 7. In addition, the contractor will comply with the OSHA work safety standards.

- 8. **Security** The contractor will comply with all established security policies at Concord Park. Due to periods of heightened security that may affect the access to the areas covered under this contract, there may be periodic closures, which in turn may reduce or inhibit the Contractor's ability to access certain areas. During periods of heightened security, the Government reserves the right, at any time, to reschedule and/or cancel any subsequent service. The Contractor shall be given at least 24-hour notice of any such closure.

B. TECHNICAL

LOCATIONS

1. Schedule Inspection and Maintenance

Upon contract award, the Contractor shall schedule quarterly inspections for a period oftwelve months (a total of four visits). The Contractor shall inspect and perform preventative maintenance service to all strength and cardio equipment located in the Fitness Center. All activities will be performed on-site and will not require the removal of any equipment. The equipment located at Concord Park includes the following:

After each site visit the contractor will provide a summary of the work completed and any deficiencies that were noted during the inspection/maintenance service to the Technical Point of Contact at the time the work is completed. If replacement parts are required, the contractor will provide a written quote to the Technical Point of Contact. No parts or materials may be ordered without written approval from the Technical Pointof Contact and a signed modification by the Contracting Officer if required.

2. Un-Scheduled Inspection and Maintenance

In the event that a piece of equipment needs maintenance or repair prior to the date of the next scheduled inspection and maintenance activity, the contractor shall perform an Un- Scheduled Inspection and Maintenance activity. The Technical Point of Contact will notify the Contractor of the need for any Un-Scheduled Inspection and Maintenance. The Contractor will provide the requested service no later than one week after the notification. All activities will be performed on-site and will not require the removal of any equipment. The equipment included in this task is listed in the previous section.

After each site visit the contractor will provide a summary of the work completed and any deficiencies that were noted during the inspection/maintenance service to the Technical Point of Contact at the time the work is completed. If replacement parts are required, the contractor will provide a written quote to the Technical Point of Contact. No parts or materials may be ordered without written approval from the Technical Pointof Contact and a signed modification by the Contracting Officer if required.

It should be assumed that this task will be required no more than three (3) times and thateach occurrence will not include more than two (2) pieces of equipment.

3. Repair Parts and Supplies

It is understood that repair parts and supplies will be required to maintain the operational status of the equipment. For any worn or damaged parts in need of replacement, the

contractor will supply the Technical Point of Contact with a quote of repair parts and supplies, to include an estimated installation fee. The quote will include an itemized list of each repair part with individual prices and the associated inspection report. The quote must also include any associated mark up. All parts and materials used will be new and conform to the original equipment manufacturer specifications. The Technical Point of Contact will provide written approval prior to the purchase and installation of a new partsor supplies not included in the routine maintenance activities. It should be assumed that this task will be required no more than three (3) times per each 12-month contract period. Repair parts price shall not exceed \$3,100 in the Base Year, \$3,200 in Option Year One, and \$3,300 in Option Year Two.

4. Scheduled Labor for Repairs

Per yearly basis, the government estimates that no more than 15 hours will be needed forall necessary installation of replacement parts. The estimated installation fees will be included on the itemized quote. This will only come into effect when work is being doneoutside the routine maintenance activities (i.e. replacement of a treadmill belt.)
