REQUEST FOR INFORMATION

Question 1: PWS Section II.4.g mandates that the supplier is required to stake down each portable toilet. However, a review of the provided map attachments indicates that several of the designated service areas (e.g., Buzzards Bay Recreation Area, Sandcatcher Recreation Area) consist of paved asphalt or concrete surfaces. Can the Government confirm if non-penetrating securing methods, such as heavy-duty water weights or sandbags, are acceptable alternatives to staking for units placed on hard surfaces to prevent property damage?

Response 1: Non-penetrating methods such as heavy-duty weights (sandbags) can be used. No stakes shall penetrate paved areas.

Question 2: PWS Section I.10 states that the contractor may be provided one (1) key to access the service areas. Given the strict daily servicing windows (only before 9:00 AM or after 6:00 PM) and the geographic spread of the 10 distinct locations across the canal, multiple service trucks may need to operate concurrently to meet the timeline. Will the Government issue additional keys for multiple concurrent service vehicles, or must all logistics be sequenced using only the single provided key?

Response 2: If multiple service trucks are required, the Government will issue multiple keys, however, all keys shall be physically handed to the Technical Point of Contact at the end of the contract period. Final payment may be withheld until all keys are returned.

Question 3: The Solicitation Survey instructions state that subcontractor experience and key personnel will only be considered if a "signed teaming arrangement is submitted". Can the Government confirm if a standard commercial Teaming Agreement or Letter of Commitment executed between the Prime Contractor and the Subcontractor is acceptable, or is there a specific Government-furnished form required to satisfy this requirement?

Response 3: There is no standard commercial teaming agreement required. Documentation that the subcontractor understands the requirements and has agreed to perform the work for the prime contractor, signed by both the subcontractor and prime contractor is sufficient as a teaming

arrangement. Documents that are vague and do not include clear identification of the subcontractor, and their signature are not acceptable.

Question 4: PWS Section I.8 requires a Pre-Work Conference to be conducted within seven business days of contract award. For prime contractors managing local subcontractors from an out-of-state headquarters, will the Government permit this conference to be attended virtually (e.g., via Microsoft Teams or teleconference), or is physical on-site attendance strictly mandatory for the Prime Contractor's Project Manager?

Response 4: The Performance Work Statement does not require the prime contractor's project manager to physically attend a pre-work conference; therefore, coordination shall be with the Technical Point of Contact on method and form of pre-work conference.
