

## LIEUTENANT COLONEL MARK D. GILLMAN

Deputy Commander and Deputy District Engineer New England District



Lieutenant Colonel Mark Gillman is the Deputy Commander and Deputy District Engineer of the New England District, U.S. Army

Corps of Engineers. He joined the District team in August 2019 as Major Gillman and was promoted to his current rank in August 2020.

A native of Las Vegas, Nevada, Lt. Col. Gillman received a commission into the United States Army Corps of Engineers in 2004 from the United States Military Academy at West Point, New York. He began his career in Schofield Barracks, Hawaii with the 25<sup>th</sup> Infantry Division where he served as a Sapper Platoon Leader, Company Executive Officer, and Assistant Brigade Engineer, including a deployment to Iraq. Lt. Col. Gillman then served with the 101<sup>st</sup> Infantry Division (Air Assault) in Fort Campbell, Kentucky, where he commanded the Sapper Company in the 4<sup>th</sup> Brigade Combat Team (Currahee), including a deployment to Afghanistan. He then went to the 19<sup>th</sup> Engineer Battalion in Fort Knox, Kentucky where he served as the Battalion Operations officer and then Executive Officer. His previous assignment was in Fort Bragg, North Carolina with the XVIII Airborne Corps, where he deployed to Kuwait as a Strategic Planner with Combined Joint Task Force Operation Inherent Resolve.

Lt. Col. Gillman earned a bachelor's degree in Electrical Engineering from the United States Military Academy in West Point, New York, a Master's Degree in Engineering Management from the University of Missouri, Science & Technology, a Master's Degree in Electrical Engineering from the Massachusetts Institute of Technology in Cambridge, Massachusetts, where he was also a Draper Laboratories Fellow, and a Master's Degree in Military Operations from the School of Advanced Military Studies in Fort Leavenworth, Kansas. His publications include articles in the U.S. Army's Engineer Professional Bulletin, the IEEE's Sensors Journal, and the Defense Acquisitions, Technology & Logistics Magazine.

Lt. Col. Gillman's awards, decorations, and badges include the Bronze Star, Defense Meritorious Service Medal, Meritorious Service Medal, Army Commendation Medal, Army Achievement Medal, Parachutist Badge, Air Assault Badge, Pathfinder Badge, Combat Action Badge, Ranger Tab, and the Bronze DeFluery Medal. He is a licensed Professional Engineer in the state of Missouri. He is an active member of IEEE, SAME, and AUSA, and speaks fluent Japanese.
