SUBMITTALS:

I. General:

1. Scope – Furnish all equipment, supplies, materials, transportation, and labor to perform plumbing services at the Elm Brook Park recreation area, including de-winterizing the park water system in the spring and winterizing the park water system in the fall. All work shall be completed in accordance with the following Performance Work Statement.

- **2.** Location(s) Elm Brook Park is located at 102 Elm Brook Park Road in Hopkinton, New Hampshire.
- **3. Site Visit** Contact the Technical Point of Contact (TPOC) to arrange a site visit. The TPOC for the project is Project Ranger, Samantha Schupp (978-318-8735, 603-746-3601 ext. 735 or Samantha.N.Schupp@usace.army.mil).
- 4. Schedule The period of performance shall be from Contract Award through 31 October 2025. In addition, the Government may exercise one option year with the same scope of services. Option year one will have a period of performance of 01 November 2025 through 31 October 2026. Work shall be performed Monday through Friday 7:00 AM to 3:00 PM unless otherwise approved by the TPOC. No work shall be done on weekends or Government holidays. The Pre-Work Conference shall be completed within 14 days of Contract Award.

All pre-work submittals shall be submitted within 21 days of contract award. The Government reserves up to 21 days for review and acceptance on each submittal/resubmittal from the date of receipt. 5. Safety Requirements:

a. General:

All work shall be conducted in accordance with the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (USACE) Safety and Occupational Health Requirements (EM 385-1-1, most recent edition), and all applicable Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA), federal, state, and local safety and health requirements. Project staff reserve the right to cease work at any time should the safety of employees, Contractors, and/or the public become jeopardized.

b. Accident Prevention Plan (APP):

The Contractor shall prepare a site-specific Accident Prevention Plan. The APP must be written by a Competent Person (CP) and document the specific work processes, equipment, materials to be used, hazards and applicable control measures.

A preparatory meeting shall be conducted by the Prime Contractor to discuss the APP contents with all effected onsite employees. The Prime Contractor is responsible for informing the subcontractors of the safety provisions under the terms of the contract, the penalties for noncompliance, and inspecting subcontractor operations to ensure that accident prevention responsibilities are being carried out.

<u>Daily safety meetings shall be held and documented.</u> Records shall be available to the <u>TPOC upon request.</u>

c. Activity Hazard Analysis (AHA):

An AHA shall be submitted and accepted for each definable feature of work (DFOW) in accordance with EM 385-1-1, Chapter 2-6. A DFOW is defined as any task, which is separate and distinct from other tasks, has separate control requirements, or is identified

as different trades or disciplines. The AHA shall be continuously reviewed and revised to address changing site conditions as appropriate.

d. Site Safety and Health Officer (SSHO) Requirements:

The Contractor shall employ a minimum of one person to function as a Level 3, SSHO. A Level 3 SSHO is a designated Qualified Person (QP) or Competent Person (CP) with Safety and Occupational Health (SOH) responsibility that meets the requirements of EM 385-1-1, Chapter 2-3.b and 2-4.b.

Level 3 SSHOs must have training, knowledge, and/or experience identifying hazards and implementing controls for the work being performed.

The SSHO shall be present at the project site and be responsible for overseeing the implementation of the prime Contractor's SOH program. Contractor shall designate all SSHOs on a mandatory ENG Form 6282 (Site Safety and Health Officer Designation Letter):

e. First-Aid and CPR Personnel Requirements:

For shifts with multiple employees, provide at least two employees that are certified to administer First Aid and CPR. When employees work alone, they must be certified in First Aid and be provided an effective means of communication to call for assistance in the event of an emergency. Minimum First Aid and CPR qualifications are outlined in EM 385-1-1, Chapter 3-3.

f. Additional Personnel Requirements:

Other Competent Person (CP) or Qualified Persons (QP) may be required per EM 385-1-1 and/or other sections of this Performance Work Statement, based on the definable features of work for this project.

g. Accident Reporting:

All accidents and near misses shall be investigated by the Contractor and reported to the TPOC in accordance with EM 385-1-1, Table 2-1.

h. Employee Exposure Data:

The Contractor shall electronically report total employee work hours (including subcontractors) to the TPOC by close of business on the 10th calendar day of the following month.

- **6. Flooding** Hopkinton Everett Lakes is primarily a Flood Risk Management Project. Occasional retention of floodwaters may inundate portions of the dam property or access roads in the areas covered by this contract. The TPOC will notify the Contractor as areas are closed as a result of floodwaters. When flooding ends and waters recede, the TPOC will notify the Contractor as areas reopen and services may resume.
- 7. Changes to Frequency and/or Quantities The Government reserves the option, should it become necessary, to decrease or increase service frequencies and/or facility quantities in any or all designated project areas. The Government may also, at any time during the duration of this contract, close any property or portion of the property and delete any subsequent service in the closed property or area. The Contractor shall be given adequate notification to prepare for either contingency. This decrease or increase will be deducted from or paid for in accordance with the bidding schedule or a negotiated cost. Any increase in quantity or frequency of services must be negotiated with the Contracting Officer. The Contractor shall not perform any additional services until the issuance of a formal modification signed by the Contracting Officer. In addition, the TPOC may, on special occasions decide to reschedule a service frequency in order to avoid conflict with visitation or unnecessary expense. The Contractor shall be given at least 24 hours' notice.
- 8. Pre-Work Conference Prior to the start of any work, the TPOC will schedule and conduct a "Pre-Work Conference". The Contractor's Project Manager and Quality Control Personnel shall be physically present at this meeting. The Contractor shall directly oversee all work on the project and the Project Manager and Quality Control Personnel shall have the authority to act on behalf of the Contractor. This conference will be held at the time and location agreeable to the Government and Contractor. No work may be performed under this contract prior to this conference. The purpose of the conference is to enable the TPOC to outline the procedures that will be followed by the Government in its administration of the contract, and to discuss the performance that will be expected from the Contractor. This conference will allow the Contractor an opportunity to ask questions about the Government's administration and inspection of contract work or obtain other pertinent information that might be required. At the Pre-Work Conference the Contractor shall provide the name of the Project Superintendent with a telephone number for project coordination.

The following is a general list of items for discussion during this Pre-Work Conference:

- i. Authority of the Technical Point of Contact and Quality Assurance Inspectors.

- 9. **Permits** The Contractor shall, without additional expense to the Government, be responsible for obtaining any necessary licenses, permits, and letters of certification. The Contractor shall comply with any applicable Federal, State, county, and municipal laws, codes, and regulations in connection with the performance of the work specified under this contract.
- 10. Security The Contractor will comply with all established security policies at the Hopkinton Dam. Due to periods of heightened security that may affect the access to the areas covered under this contract, the Government reserves the right to close any property or portion of property and reschedule and/or cancel any subsequent service. II. Technical Requirements:

Part 1 General:

- 1. Summary Furnish all equipment, supplies, materials, transportation, and labor to perform plumbing services at the Elm Brook Park recreation area, including de-winterizing the park water system in the spring and winterizing the park water system in the fall. All work shall be completed in accordance with the following Performance Work Statement and schedule.
- 2. Submittals Although the Government reviews submissions required by this Performance Work Statement, it is emphasized that the Contractor's work must be completed using proper internal controls and review procedures. The Government reserves up to 21 days for review and acceptance on each submittal/resubmittal from the date of receipt. If revisions are necessary to the submittals, the Contractor shall make such revisions and shall resubmit to the Government in an acceptable form within 14 days of the Government's response, unless additional time is granted by the Government in writing.

The documents identified below must be prepared in accordance with the applicable standards, submitted to the TPOC for review and must be accepted by the Government.

Pre-Work Submittals: Submitted within 21 days of Contract Award. Submittals must be accepted prior to the commencement of any field work activities.

- 3. References All work shall be in conformance with:
 - a. U.S. Army Corps of Engineers
 - i. EM-385-1-1 2024 Safety and Occupational Health Requirements, U.S. Army Engineering Manual.
 - **b.** Code of Federal Regulations
 - i. Title 36 Parks, Forests, and Public Property; Chapter III, Part 327 Corps of Engineers, Department of the Army.
 - c. Other appropriate federal, state, and local codes.
 - d. Env-Dw 506 Seasonal Public Water Systems.
 - e. NHDES Env Fact Sheet DWGB-4-11; Disinfecting a Drinking Water Well.
- **4. Other Contracts** The Government may undertake or award other contracts for additional work not related to this contract, and the Contractor shall fully cooperate with other Contractors and Government employees. The Contractor shall not commit or permit any act which will interfere with the performance of work by another Contractor or by Government employees.
- **5. Preferred Sequence for Work Schedules** The Contractor must provide sufficient personnel, equipment, and materials to accomplish services stated in the contract. The Contractor will coordinate a work schedule for each service, and approximate times for beginning and ending of each required service listed with the TPOC. Any changes or alterations to the schedule must be coordinated and approved by the TPOC in advance of actual schedule changes.
- 6. Clean Up and Waste Disposal The Contractor shall practice good housekeeping to maintain a safe job site. The Contractor shall keep the work area, including any designated storage areas free from accumulation of waste materials. Upon completing work in an area, the Contractor shall remove any tools, equipment, and materials that are not the property of the Government. Any and all disturbed areas resulting from Contractor activities shall be restored by the Contractor to the satisfaction of the TPOC. All waste material will be

disposed of offsite in accordance with all Federal, State, and local regulations.

- 7. Environmental Protection –Water, air and land resources shall not be adversely impacted during the course of the work. The Contractor will take necessary steps to ensure all federal, state, and local environmental regulatory requirements are met at no additional cost to the Government. Assurance of compliance with this section by subcontractors shall be the responsibility of the Contractor.
- 8. Sustainability & Environmentally Preferred Products The United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) designates certain bio-based products for federal procurement and specifies minimum bio-based content levels for those products. Any designated product that is being offered or supplied under this contract shall meet USDA BioPreferred's minimum bio-based content level. - **9. Personal Protective Equipment** It is the Contractor's responsibility to furnish and supply personnel with the proper personal protective equipment necessary for performing the work.
- **10. Government Resources** The Contractor shall supply his own means of communication (telephone). The restrooms in Elm Brook Park will be available for use after the dewinterization service is completed. The Contractor would have to provide these resources or have an acceptable alternative plan for these resources.
- 11. Damage to Government and Private Property The Contractor shall be responsible for restoring all Government facilities or structures damaged as a result of the Contractor's operation. The Contractor shall also be responsible for any damage to private property or injury to any person as a result of the Contractor's operation. The Contractor shall notify the TPOC immediately of damage to Government and private property and injury to any person resulting from the Contractor's operation. Also, the Contractor shall notify the TPOC of damage to Government facilities due to vandalism or other causes on the day such damage is first noticed. Trucks and/or trailers will be driven on existing roads only and not across or through park areas to facilities. The Contractor shall also restore landscape features (shrubs, flowers, grasses, etc.), which are damaged or destroyed by the Contractor's operation. Damaged or destroyed grass areas shall be re-planted as directed by the TPOC, and shrubs and flowers which are damaged or destroyed shall be replaced from nursery stock of like size and kind.

12. Contractor's Personnel -

a. Minimum Personnel Requirements - The Contractor shall provide an adequate number of fully qualified personnel to perform the specified service properly and efficiently within the time limits specified. The Contractor shall provide a list of the names and contact phone numbers for all employees prior to them working on Government Property.

Note: At least one (1) of the Contractor employees on site shall be able to communicate effectively and efficiently with project staff.

b. Employee Conduct - The Contractor shall be responsible for seeing that the Contractor's employees strictly comply with Code of Federal Regulations (CFR) Title 36, Chapter III, Part 327, and all Federal, State, and municipal laws. Any personnel activity, which, in the opinion of the Government, is deemed detrimental to the performance of the contract may result in the removal of Contractor employee(s).

Examples of unbecoming actions or conduct include but are not limited to the following:

- i. Cursing, harassment, or discrimination of and/or unwarranted physical contact with visitors, USACE personnel, or other Contractors.
- **ii.** Recurring written and/or verbal complaints from visitors, USACE personnel, or other Contractors.
- iii. Unsafe operation of vehicles while on USACE property.
- c. Removal of Contractor's Employees The TPOC may require the Contractor to immediately remove from the work site any employee of the Contractor or subcontractor, who, in the opinion of the TPOC, endangers persons or property, or whose physical or mental condition is such that it would impair the employee's ability to satisfactorily perform assigned work. Notification to the Contractor shall be promptly made in writing if time and circumstances permit. Otherwise, notification shall be verbal or by telephone, and shall be confirmed in writing as soon as possible. No such removal, however, will reduce the Contractor's obligation to perform all work required under this contract, and immediate replacement will be made as required. This requirement shall not be made the basis of any claim for compensation or damages against the United States or any of its officers or agents.
- **13. Quality Assurance** The Contractor is responsible for the quality control of the contract work. The Contractor shall establish and maintain a quality control system to assure compliance with the contract requirements. The Government has the right to inspect and test all items called for by the contract, to the extent practicable at all times and at all places during the term of the contract.

14. Inspections-

- **a.** Contractor Quality Control The Contractor is responsible for establishing and maintaining an adequate quality control system to satisfactorily inspect and ensure that all work performed by the Contractor's organization in each separate service is in full compliance with this contract and the instructions, provisions, specifications, drawings, and maps herein.
- **b.** General Inspection Upon the completion of each service requirement, the Contractor will perform an inspection of all areas under this contract to ensure compliance with the Performance Work Statement. The Contractor or their representative must be able to commit personnel, equipment, and resources to correct deficiencies. A Government

representative may accompany the Contractor on an inspection of completed work and will identify any contract deficiencies. Any deficiencies noted will be corrected within original contract time frames or appropriate deductions in payment will be made.

- c. Equipment/Supplies Inspections The TPOC may inspect required equipment and, supplies at any time when in use on Government property. Any equipment found deficient shall be removed from service immediately until faulty conditions have been corrected and passed by the TPOC. No such removal will reduce the Contractor's obligation to perform all work required within the time scheduled under this contract. This requirement shall not be made the basis of any claim for compensation or damages against the United States or any of its officers or agents.
- **d. Government Inspections** The Government will monitor the Contractor's service performance. Any work that does not comply with the requirements and is not corrected by the Contractor may result in deductions in payment.
- **15. Receiving and Storing Materials** The Contractor is responsible for receiving and unloading of delivered goods. Government employees will not receive materials or supplies for the Contractor and will not be responsible for damage to the Contractor's equipment or materials.
- **16. Omissions** This contract may not cover all specified activities, steps, and procedures required to supply the contract product. In case of omission, the normal industry, State, or Federal standards, practices, specifications, and/or guides shall prevail. In no instance shall an omission be reason to produce less than an acceptable product.

Part 2 Equipment:

1. Condition of Equipment—All equipment used to perform work under this contract must be in good operating and mechanical condition and comply with EM 385-1-1, Army Corps of Engineers Safety and Occupational Health Requirements. A regular schedule of preventive maintenance must be followed on all equipment. All vehicles utilized under this contract will be presentable, serviceable, and shall comply with safety standards.

2. Type(s) of Equipment-

- **b.** The Contractor shall provide the appropriate equipment and tools of the trade to execute the requirements of the Performance Work Statement.
- **c.** Types of equipment for this work may include but not be limited to:
 - i. Air compressor
 - Air compressor shall have the capacity to purge all water from the park water system without rupturing any pipes.
- **3.** Equipment Storage No Government space or facilities shall be provided under this contract.

Part 3 Materials and Supplies:

- **1.** Provided by Government:
 - a. Sloan flush valve assemblies
 - **b.** Pressure tanks

NOTE: Government furnished supplies valued under \$300.00 each.

- **2.** Provided by Contractor:
 - a. Chlorine pellets and standard liquid bleach
 - **b.** Non-toxic RV anti-freeze
 - **c.** Plumbing tools (pliers, wrenches, etc.)
 - **d.** Flexible PVC Caps for drain/waste/vent (DWV) to cap pressure tanks and pressure tank connections
 - e. Garden hoses

NOTE: All materials shall be new, un-used and to the satisfaction of the TPOC.

Part 4 Service Requirements:

1. General: Furnish all equipment, supplies, materials, transportation, and labor to perform plumbing services at the Elm Brook Park recreation area, including de-winterizing the park water system in the spring and winterizing the park water system in the fall. All work shall be completed in accordance with the following Performance Work Statement and schedule.

2. Service Definition:

- **a.** One service is defined as a single completion of all requirements for each task as described in Section 3, Service Tasks below.
- **b.** The Contractor shall only be paid for work fully completed. If a partial service is rendered, payment will be adjusted according to percent of area completed. Partial service is defined as completing anything other than all tasks for designated locations as identified in Part 5, Service Location(s), and Task Requirements.

3. Service Tasks:

- a. De-Winterizing Park Water System Requirements:
 - i. Connect three (3) water pressure tanks; one at the well pump house and one located in each of the restroom pipe chases.
 - ii. Connect twelve (12) toilet and four (4) urinal flush valve assemblies.
 - iii. Connect nine (9) sink traps.
 - iv. Connect four (4) spigots to water fountains.
 - v. Check all flush valves, faucets, and water fountains for leaks.
 - vi. Disinfect the park water system and the Park Ranger cabin water system using the proper dosage of either standard liquid bleach (8.25%) or 70% chlorine pellets to obtain a disinfection dose of approximately 50 parts per million (ppm) in all parts of

- the well and water system. The recommended dosage consists of approximately ³/₄ gallon of standard liquid bleach (8.25%) and 25 chlorine pellets per drilled well.
- vii. Follow manufacturer procedures for system startup and perform a full flush cycle on the two water sediment filtration systems located in the well pump house. Ensure that the chlorine treatment has fully entered the filtration systems. See Exhibits 4 and 5.
 - The water sediment filtration systems each have a Clack Corporation size 1665 mineral / media vessel with a Water-Right Water Conditioner valve system and control panel model number: IMBF-1665A-00-05-00-00-00. Each vessel contains standard water sediment filtration media (AG) as prescribed in 2010 when the system was installed.
- viii. Systematically run the water system from the well pump house to the next valve opening until the bleach solution is in all of the water lines. The Contractor shall be able to detect the smell of bleach from all fixtures to know the bleach solution has been distributed to all water lines and end points. The disinfection dose shall remain in the system for 12-24 hours.
 - ix. After the disinfectant has been in the system for 12-24 hours, flush the chlorine from the system. Connect garden hoses to the spigots at the water fountains and restrooms and flush the water to either a wood line or field as specified by the TPOC. After flushing the water from the spigots at half the flow capacity for approximately 2 hours, continue flushing the system by turning on all sink faucets and flushing toilets until the free chlorine level is less than 1.0 mg/L free chlorine and the scent of chlorine can no longer be detected at the end points. This procedure is specified in the NHDES Drinking Water & Groundwater Bureau's Start-up Guidance for Seasonal Public Water Systems and in the Disinfecting a Drinking Water Well Fact Sheet.
 - **x.** Check to ensure the wellhead caps or covers are secure with seals intact and a screened vent.

NOTE: The standard liquid bleach used shall be free of detergents or fragrances.

<u>NOTE:</u> Pool bleach additives are not permitted for disinfecting the park water system. Pool bleach additives contain algaecides and are not certified for drinking water use.

<u>NOTE:</u> Wells deeper than 200 ft. require chlorine pellets in addition to bleach to improve dispersion deep into the well. Both drilled wells in Elm Brook Park are 340 feet deep.

<u>NOTE:</u> When flushing the disinfectant from the water lines, caution shall be taken not to draw the static water level below the pump level. The lines shall be flushed at half the flow capacity at the end points.

<u>NOTE:</u> The park water system may require a second round of disinfection if the water quality samples test positive for bacteria. The water quality testing will be completed as part of a separate contract. The initial water quality testing will occur

within one (1) week of the de-winterization service being completed. If a second round of disinfection is needed, the Contractor shall be notified within 1 business day, and a second round of disinfection would be required to be completed no later than May 20.

b. Option Task: Second Disinfectant Treatment

- i. If water quality samples from either the park water system and/or the Park Ranger cabin water system test positive for bacteria after the first disinfection treatment, a second round of disinfection treatment will be required for one or both water systems. The second round of disinfection treatment shall involve repeating steps viii to x from Service Task a. De-Winterizing Park Water System Requirements.
- ii. The Government is only obligated to pay for work completed.

c. Winterizing Park Water System Requirements:

- i. Perform a full flush cycle on the two water sediment filtration systems located in the well pump house and follow manufacturer procedures to prepare for winter closing. See Exhibits 4 and 5.
- ii. Disconnect three (3) water pressure tanks; one at the well pump house and one located in each of the restroom pipe chases.
- **iii.** Transport the water pressure tank from the lower restroom to the well pump house for storage.
- iv. Cap the pipe connections for the pressure tanks at each restroom and well pump house connection.
- v. Cap each of the pressure tank connections on each pressure tank after they have been disconnected and emptied.
- vi. Open drain valves at each water fountain to drain.
- vii. Drain the water system and blow out the piping with air pressure starting at the well house tank.
- viii. Remove all fixture stop stems and toilet/urinal flush valves to drain them.
- ix. Disconnect sink traps.
- **x.** Pour enough non-toxic RV anti-freeze into each of the toilets and urinals to fill the traps.
- xi. Final product shall include all water being purged from the park water system.

Place of manufacture means the place where an end product is assembled out of components, or otherwise made or processed from raw materials into the finished product that is to be provided to the Government. If a product is disassembled and reassembled, the place of reassembly is not the place of manufacture.

Predecessor means an entity that is replaced by a successor and includes any predecessors of the predecessor. Reasonable inquiry has the meaning provided in the clause 52.204–25, Prohibition on Contracting for Certain Telecommunications and Video Surveillance Services or Equipment.


