Performance Work Statement

A. GENERAL

1. Scope – Furnish all equipment, materials, labor and transportation to perform area mowing services at the Edward MacDowell Lake. Furnish all equipment, materials, labor and transportation necessary to mow and trim approximately 9.7 acres of grass at the Edward MacDowell Dam and Project Office area; approximately 6.6 acres of weekly mowing and trimming, .4 acres of bi-weekly, 2.3 acres of monthly mowing, approximately .5 acres of semi-annual mowing. Additionally, 1.2 acres of aeration and fertilization, and a spring and fall clean-up will be performed on the entire 9.7 acres at the Edward MacDowell Dam Project Area. Services are to be provided in accordance with the following performance work statement and schedule. Contractor's work and responsibility shall include, but not be limited to, all job planning, programming, scheduling, administration, inspection, personnel, equipment, vehicles, fuel, materials, supplies, supervision, and quality control necessary to perform the various services required herein. The mowing areas include changes in terrain such as steep slopes, rocky areas, wet areas, and areas with stumps and other obstacles.

Work shall be performed in a timely manner and to the satisfaction of the Technical Point of Contact or their representative.

- 2. Location The Edward MacDowell Dam Project Area is located on the Nubanusit River located in the town of Peterborough, New Hampshire. The project office is located at 75 Wilder Street in Peterborough, New Hampshire.
- **3. Site Visit-** Contact the Technical Point of Contact, Project Manager (603-924-3431 at extension 314 or jason.c.tremblay@usace.army.mil) to arrange a site visit.
- 4. Schedule- Dates listed in the performance work statement are for the 2019 season. The period of performance is from on or about 1 April 2019 through 15 November 2019. In addition, the Government may exercise one (1) optional year with the same scope of services. Optional year one (1) would include a period of performance from 1 April 2020 through 15 November 2020.

The Technical Point of Contact shall provide the Contractor with a preferred sequence, or order, of work. (Note: The Contractor must provide sufficient personnel and equipment to accomplish services stated in the contract). The Contractor will then be required to submit a work schedule for each service, and approximate times for beginning and ending of each required service listed. Any proposed change to an approved schedule must be submitted in writing, coordinated and approved by the Technical Point of Contact in advance of actual schedule changes.

Mowing and trimming will not be permitted before 7:00 am or after 7:00 pm within park areas or facilities, unless approved in advance by the Technical Point of Contact. No mowing or trimming will be done on Saturdays, Sundays, and holidays unless approved in advance by the Technical Point of Contact.

5. Pre-Work Conference —Prior to the start of any work, the Technical Point of Contact will schedule and conduct a "Pre-work Conference". The Contractor's Project Manager and Quality Control Personnel will attend this meeting. This conference will be held at the time and location agreeable to the government and contractor. No work may be performed under this contract prior to this conference. The purpose of the conference is to enable the Technical Point of Contact to outline the procedures that will be followed by the Government in its administration of the contract, and to discuss the performance that will be expected from the Contractor. This conference will allow the Contractor an opportunity to ask questions about the Government's administration and inspection of contract work or obtain other pertinent information that might be required. At the Pre-work conference the contractor shall provide the name of the project superintendent with a telephone number for project coordination.

- **6. Permits** The Contractor shall, without additional expense to the Government, be responsible for obtaining any necessary licenses, permits, and letters of certification. The Contractor shall comply with any applicable Federal, State, County, and Municipal laws, codes, and regulations in connection with the performance of the work specified under this contract.
- 7. Security The contractor will comply with all established security policies at Edward MacDowell Lake. Due to periods of heightened security that may affect the access to the areas covered under this contract, areas may be subject to periodic closures, which in turn may reduce or inhibit the Contractor's ability to access certain areas. During periods of heightened security, the Government reserves the right, at any time, to close any property or portion of property and reschedule and/or cancel any subsequent service in an area. The Contractor shall be given at least 24 hour notice of any such closure.

- 8. Flooding Edward MacDowell Lake is a flood control project. Occasional retention of floodwaters may inundate portions of the mowing and maintenance areas or access roads to these areas. Therefore, it may become necessary to decrease or reschedule mowing frequencies in any or all portions of the property, and/or to close any portion of a property and delete any subsequent service for the closed property or area. Payment for the decreased service will be adjusted in accordance with the contract unit prices.
- 9. Contractor Conduct The Contractor and Employees shall not use or be under the influence of drugs or alcohol at any time while performing the obligations under this contract or giving the public the appearance of same. Firearms are prohibited on project grounds. Contractor and employees must comply with CFR 36 Rules and Regulations.
- 10. Payment The contractor will furnish the Technical Point of Contact with one monthly invoice, stating the service(s) performed and the amount to be paid. Payment shall be made monthly for the actual services performed at the applicable contract unit price.

B. TECHNICAL

General Requirements

- 1. **Summary**: Furnish all equipment, materials, labor and transportation to perform area mowing services at Edward MacDowell Lake.
- 2. Safety Requirements: All work shall be conducted in accordance with the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers Safety and Health requirements Manual (EM 385-1-1, most recent edition), and all applicable federal, state, and local safety and health requirements. A copy of EM 385-1-1 can be accessed electronically at Headquarters USACE website under publications using the following link: http://www.publications.usace.army.mil/Portals/76/Publications/EngineerManuals/EM 385-1-1.pdf

a. Modified Activity Hazard Analysis

- i. A Modified AHA shall be submitted and must cover all the major phases of work. A major phase of work is defined as an operation involving a type of work presenting hazards not experienced in previous operations or where a new subcontractor or work crew is to perform the work. The analysis shall define all activities to be performed, identify the sequence of work, the specific hazards anticipated, and the control measures to be implemented to eliminate or reduce each hazard to an acceptable level. Work shall not proceed on a phase of work until the AHAs have been accepted by the Government Designated Authority (GDA). A preparatory meeting shall be conducted by the contractor to discuss the Modified AHA's contents with all effected onsite employees. The Modified AHA shall be continuously reviewed and revised to address changing site conditions as appropriate. The AHA's shall interface with the Contractor's overall safety and health program.
- **ii.** Emergency Reponses Procedures shall be documented in the Modified AHA and will include a map with directions to the nearest hospital, emergency contact numbers, and onsite First Aid/CPR responders.

b. Required Personnel

i. The Contractor shall designate one employee as the site's Competent Person (CP) who is responsible for ensuring a safe environment for all employees. The CP shall be present at the project site and report to the contractor's upper management. The CP is required to have related construction and/or service experience.

ii. In addition, when emergency medical services are not accessible within 5 minutes of the work location and there are 2 or more workers onsite, at least 2 employees shall be trained in First Aid and CPR. Minimum qualifications are listed in EM 385-1-1, Section 03.A.02.c.

c. Accident Reporting

i. All accidents and near misses shall be investigated by the Contractor. All work-related recordable injuries, illnesses and property damage accidents (excluding on-the-road vehicle accidents), in which the property damage exceeds \$5,000.00, shall be verbally reported to the GDA within 4 hours of the incident. Serious accidents as described in EM 385-1-1 Section 01.D shall be immediately reported to the GDA. ENG Form 3394 shall be completed and submitted to the GDA within five working days of the incident.

ii. The Contractor shall complete the attached "USACE Contractor Monthly Summary Record of Injuries/Illness and Work Hour Exposure" (for prime and its subcontractors) and forward the completed form to the GDA no later than close of business on the 5th calendar day of the following month. The method of transmission by the prime contractor to the GDA shall be electronically.

- 3. Other Contracts: The Government may undertake or award other contracts for additional work not related to this contract, and the Contractor shall fully cooperate with other Contractors and Government employees. The contractor shall not commit or permit any act, which will interfere with the performance of work by another contractor, or by Government employees.
- **4. Environmental Protection:** Container for excess and / or waste materials, rubbish, etc. shall be provided by the contractor at the site, and the site will be inspected/ cleaned on a daily basis. No burning is permissible. Water, air and land resources shall not be adversely impacted during the course of the work. Contractor will take necessary steps to ensure all federal, state, and local environmental regulatory requirements are met.
- 5. Preferred Sequence for Work Schedules: The Contractor will be required to submit a work schedule for each service area with approximate times for beginning and ending of each required service area listed. Any proposed change to an approved schedule must be submitted in writing, coordinated and approved by the Technical Point of Contact in advance of actual schedule changes. (Note: The Contractor must provide sufficient personnel and equipment to accomplish services stated in the contract).
- 6. Damage to Government and Private Property: The Contractor shall be responsible for restoring any Government facilities or structures damaged as a result of the Contractor's actions. The Contractor shall also be responsible for any damage to private property or injury to any person as a result of the company's operations. The Contractor shall notify the Technical Point of Contact immediately of damage to Government and private property and injury to any person resulting from the Contractors' operation. Also, the Contractor shall notify the Technical Point of Contact of damage to Government facilities due to vandalism or other causes on the day such damage is first noticed. Trucks and/or trailers will be driven on existing roads only and not across or through park areas to facilities. The Contractor shall also restore landscape features (shrubs, flowers, grasses, etc.), which are damaged or destroyed by the company's operation. Damaged or destroyed grass areas shall be re-planted as directed by the Technical Point of Contact, and shrubs and flowers which are damaged or destroyed shall be replaced from nursery stock of like size and kind.

7. Contractor's Personnel:

- **a. Minimum Personnel Requirements** The Contractor shall provide an adequate number of fully qualified personnel to perform the specified service properly and efficiently within the time limits specified. The Contractor shall provide a list of the names and contact phone numbers for all employees prior to them working on Government Property.
- **b.** Employee Conduct The Contractor shall be responsible for seeing that the company's employees strictly comply withal Federal, State, and Municipal laws. Any personnel activity, which, in the opinion of the Government, is deemed detrimental to the performance of the contract may result in the removal of Contractor employee/employees and/or termination of the contract.
- c. Removal of Contractor's Employees The Technical Point of Contact may require the Contractor to immediately remove from the work site any employee of the Contractor or subcontractor, who, in the opinion of the Technical Point of Contact, is incompetent, who endangers persons or property, or whose physical or mental condition is such that it would impair the employee's ability to satisfactorily perform assigned work. Notification to the Contractor shall be promptly made in writing if time and circumstances permit. Otherwise, notification shall be verbal or by telephone, and shall be confirmed in writing as soon as possible. No such removal, however, will reduce the Contractor's obligation to perform all work required under this contract, and immediate replacement will be made as required. This requirement shall not be made the basis of any claim for compensation or damages against the United States or any of its officers or agents.
- **d.** Contractor Quality Control The Contractor is responsible for establishing and maintaining an adequate quality control system to satisfactorily inspect and ensure that all work performed by the Contractor's organization in each separate service is in full compliance with this contract and the instructions, provisions, specifications, drawings, and maps herein.
- e. General Inspection Upon the completion of each mowing cycle, the Contractor will perform an inspection of all areas under this contract to insure compliance with the scope of work. The Contractor or their representative must be able to commit personnel, equipment, and resources to correct deficiencies. The Services Inspection Form (form to be provided to the Contractor at the pre-work conference) will be submitted to the Technical Point of Contact to allow verification of results for payment. A Government representative may accompany the contractor on an inspection of completed work and will identify any contract deficiencies. Any deficiencies noted will be corrected within original contract time frames or appropriate deductions in payment will be made.
- f. Equipment/Supplies Observations The Technical Point of Contact may observe required equipment and, supplies at any time when in use on Government property. Any equipment found deficient shall be removed from service immediately until faulty conditions have been corrected and passed by the Technical Point of Contact. No such removal will reduce the Contractor's obligation to perform all work required within the time scheduled under this contract. This requirement shall not be made the basis of any claim for compensation or damages against the United States or any of its officers or agents.
- g. Government Inspections The Government will monitor the Contractor's service performance.

Equipment

1. Condition of Equipment: All equipment used to perform work under this contract must be in good operating and mechanical condition and comply with EM 385-1-1, Army Corps of Engineers Safety and Health Requirements. A regular schedule of preventive maintenance must be followed on all equipment. All vehicles utilized under this contract will be presentable, serviceable, and shall comply with safety standards as required by the State of New Hampshire.

2. Type of Equipment:

- **a.** Mowers shall be rotary type and equipped with suitable protective devices to prevent flying objects from injuring people or damaging property. Mowers must have slides or wheels, which will prevent tearing or plowing into the turf. The contractor will be held accountable for returfing if equipment causes gouging or plowing. In areas where it is not possible to use a tractor-mounted mower the contractor shall use small mowing equipment such as lawn and garden tractors; push mowers, weed eaters and other small power-mowing equipment, and/or manual mowing tools though the equipment must be of sufficient size to accomplish mowing in a reasonable time. Mowers must have adequate gearing; traction and / or 4-wheel drive capabilities to ensure safe and reliable operation on varying terrain.
- **b.** String trimmers may be gasoline or electrically-operated. The use of steel or other type of cord will be allowed in string trimmers, provided no damage is inflicted on buildings, sign posts, fences, or concrete structures. Powered string trimmers or hand lopper trimers shall be used to cut woody vegetation or grass in areas needed where mowing equipment cannot safely cut the vegetation.
- **c.** Aeration equipment will be tractor-drawn core type, which will remove plugs from soil. Soil plugs will be left on ground surface. Small walk behind equipment will be used on areas (and only on areas) inaccessible to larger equipment such as around picnic tables and pads, fireplaces, trees and shrubs, driveway and walkway edges, etc.
- d. Specialized Equipment: Dam embankment, dike mowing, trail side mowing and road side mowing may require the use of specialized equipment. Such equipment must be operated within any manufacturer's operating instructions and precautions. The embankment and dike mowing equipment must be certified in writing by the manufacturer as safe for operation on a maximum twenty-seven (27) degree angle of incline, (1 on 2.0), and specifically designed, or factory modified for the mowing of slopes or any other means or methods with other equipment to safely achieve the objective like a weed strimmer. All safety items required on the standard mowing equipment mentioned above are required hereon as well.
- 3. Equipment Storage: Government space and facilities are limited, but may be provided under this contract, at the discretion of the Park Manager, for the specific equipment used, and solely used, to complete the contract services herein. If granted, this privilege may be revoked at any time for any reason by the Government. There will be no liability on the part of the Government for any loss or damage of the equipment, and the contractor understands that any approved equipment storage is done at his or her own risk.

Requirements

The Contractor shall survey the area and report all damage or vandalism to the Technical Point of Contact prior to commencement of service in each area. Any damage found thereafter by the Government's inspector that has not been previously reported by the Contractor shall be assumed to be damage caused by the Contract's operation, and shall be repaired, replaced, or deducted from the invoice, as determined by the Technical Point of Contact, at no cost to the Government. NOTE: There are a number of mowing areas that are within the impoundment area of a flood control facility. As such the amount of debris can vary greatly from one year to the next, and can be severe due to prolonged inundations or storms. Several locations have rough terrain conditions. These conditions include: rocky areas, wet areas, varying degrees and species of vegetation (woody vegetation, cattails, grasses, etc.), erosion gullies, animal burrow holes; all of which could alter the time or equipment it takes to accomplish the mowing. Bid price should take this into account

1. Area Mowing Requirements: Cut and power mow grass to a height of not more than six (6) inches or

less than three (3) inches in each area around each facility. Mowing shall be uniform with no uncut or uneven areas resulting from mowing, overlap, wheel rollover, etc. Mowing shall be conducted in such a manner so there is no wheel damage

to the turf or any damage to concrete edges, signs, fences, or trees. Mowing will extend to the border of an area, whether that is a tree line, the water's edge, or an embankment. Mowing shall not take place close enough to facilities to cause damage. Mowing with heavy tractors will not be permitted when the ground is so wet or boggy that the mowing operations will cause wheel rutting. Mowing under these conditions shall be accomplished by use of smaller mowing equipment as mentioned above. Any damage from mowing equipment to government property will be the responsibility of the contractor to repair. These areas are designated in orange on the attached figures.

- 2. Slope Mowing Requirements: Several locations have slope areas of 2.5 to 1 (~27 degree slope) or greater where specialized equipment shall be used to complete the mowing. These areas are designated in red on the attached Figures. Slope mowing requirements shall be accomplished as described in the Area Mowing Requirements with the exception that specialized equipment shall be used to mow the slopes.
- 3. Trimming Requirements: Trim woody vegetation and grass to a height of not more than six (6) inches or less than three (3) inches in areas where it is necessary due to inability to effectively cut the vegetation with mowing equipment. Trimming, edging shall be conducted in such a manner so there is no damage to concrete edges, signs, or fences. If necessary, trimming shall be accomplished around all vertical objects such as against buildings, guard posts, fences, tables, trash receptacles, electrical pedestals, rocks, large vegetation, etc. Trimming shall be done when other mowing equipment cannot safely or effectively mow the grass and vegetation without damage to personnel, equipment, or property as described in the Area Mowing Requirements. The Technical Point of Contact may determine that area/facility trimming is required in conjunction
- **4. Lawn Aeration-** The upstream lower dam lawn area (indicated on map #2) will be aerated in two passes in a cross pattern. Each successive pass will meet or overlap the previous pass to eliminate missed areas. No work will take place when the soil is excessively wet or during a period of rain. Ground speed of equipment will be properly calibrated to prevent excessive bouncing of equipment, damage to the lawn area, and to assure adequate aeration results. Soil plugs will be left on ground surface. All aeration tubes on equipment will be operational and checked periodically for operability during aeration process. Damaged or non-functional tubes will be replaced as soon as problems are noted to prevent missed spots on lawn areas. Small walk behind equipment will be used on areas (and only on areas) inaccessible to larger equipment such as around picnic tables and pads, fireplaces, trees and shrubs, driveway and walkway edges, etc.
- 5. Fertilization- Contractor will supply and apply a commercially prepared granular fertilizer with a N-P-K ratio of 25-5-20 at a rate of 10 lbs. per 1000 square feet to approximately 1.2 acres of fine lawn. Contractor will be required to submit a manufacturer's label for the fertilizer to the Project Manager for approval, prior to the commencement of work. Material will be applied using a properly calibrated spreader (or equivalent) to insure complete and uniform application rates. Within a 20' strip around all ditches, structures and water, the material shall be applied by using a hand spreader. This will keep all material off the buildings.

Efforts will be taken to insure fertilizer does not come in contact with any body of water. Fertilizer will be applied when there is no dew or moisture on the turf to prevent burning of foliage. Material will be applied after closing of the recreation area, and completion of aeration, weather permitting. All work will be completed to the satisfaction of the Technical Point of Contact.

6. Spring & Fall Clean-up- Contractor will provide all labor, tools, equipment, and supplies necessary to perform the spring and fall cleaning for the grounds care areas to approximately 9.7 acres and project ditches.

Spring-Cleaning: will be at the first of the season and completed prior to the mowing services. It is intended to prepare the public use areas and facilities for the summer season. Service includes, but is not limited to, removal of all leaf and down limbs, drainage ditch cleanup, and other grounds cleanup to service areas described herein, and any other preparation necessary for park opening. All materials shall be removed and disposed of in a proper location on project property preapproved by the Technical Point of Contact. All spring-cleaning work shall occur between April 1st and May 30th of each year, unless otherwise approved by the Technical Point of Contact.

Fall-Cleaning: will be at the end of the season, and is intended to prep the public use areas and facilities for the winter season as well as prep the grounds for next spring. Service includes, but is not limited to, leaf and down limbs removal, drainage ditch cleanup, and other grounds cleanup to all day-use and service areas described herein, and any other preparation necessary. All materials shall be removed and disposed of in a proper location on project property preapproved by the Technical Point of Contact. All fall-cleaning work shall occur between October 15th and November 15th of each year, unless otherwise approved by the Technical Point of Contact.

- 7. Grounds Cleaning- Grounds cleaning will be performed in conjunction with scheduled mowing services, in order to leave the mowing area with an overall neat and clean appearance. The grounds cleaning shall remove all obvious and noticeable trash and litter from the mowing limits which are designated as the mowing boundaries on the location maps attached to these specifications. All trash and litter shall be removed and properly disposed of.
- **8. Restrictions:** All mowing and trimming required in an area shall be completed and inspected by the Contractor's Quality Control Inspector prior to beginning work in another park or area. The contractor shall notify Technical Point of Contact immediately upon completion of services, so that the Army Corps of Engineers may inspect the work. The Contractor shall be responsible for correction of any and all deficiencies discovered by the Quality Assurance inspection within twenty-four (24) hours at no additional cost to the Government.
 - a. Mowing and trimming will not be permitted within twenty (20) feet of the public or their property. If any area is occupied by the public the Contractor may ask for permission to mow the area. If permission is not granted, the area must be serviced at another time when it is not occupied.
 - b. All "Summer Mowing" requirements shall be completed in full for all locations prior to the start of the "Fall Mowing" requirements.
 - c. Care shall be taken to restrict grass clippings, as a result of mowing or trimming, from entering rip rap protection, water sources, roadways etc.
- 9. Changes to Frequency And / Or Quantities: The Government reserves the option, should it become necessary, to decrease or reschedule service frequencies and/or facility quantities in any or all project areas. The Government may also, at any time during the duration of this contract, close any property or portion of the property and delete any subsequent service in the closed property or area. The Contractor shall be given adequate notification to prepare for either contingency. This decrease will be deducted in accordance with the bidding schedule. In addition, the Technical Point of Contact may, on special occasions decide to reschedule a service frequency in order to avoid conflict with visitation or unnecessary expense. A minimum of twenty-four hours notification shall be given to the Contractor in such cases.

Service Locations

Item No. 1. Class A Mowing Services - Weekly (May – Oct)

Contractor shall furnish all labor, materials and equipment necessary to mow and trim the Day-Use areas, around the Project Office, and downstream of the Dam (approximately 6.6 acres). The specific area is delineated in this contract as the Edward MacDowell Dam Class A Mowing Services (Map 1 of 2). The

mowing, trimming and grounds cleaning requirements will be utilized for this area of the work once weekly, as needed, for a period of 22 weeks from the first week of May or as directed by the Technical Point of Contact.

Item No. 2. Class B Mowing Services - Bi-Weekly (May – Oct)

Contractor shall furnish all labor, materials and equipment necessary to mow and trim the areas behind the flag-pole turnaround (approximately .4 acres). The specific area is delineated in this contract as the Edward MacDowell Dam Class B Mowing Services (Map 1 of 2). The mowing, trimming and grounds cleaning requirements will be utilized for this area of the work twice monthly, as needed, for a period of 5 months from the first week of May or as directed by the Technical Point of Contact.

Item No. 3. Class C Mowing Services - Monthly (May – Oct)

Contractor shall furnish all labor, materials and equipment necessary to mow and trim the area in the lower day-use/ parking areas, downstream outflow embankments, and entrance roadway areas (approximately 2.3 acres). The specific area is delineated in this contract as the Edward MacDowell Dam Class C Mowing Services (Map 1 of 2). The mowing, trimming and grounds cleaning requirements will be utilized for this area of the work monthly, as needed, for a period of 6 months from the first week of May or as directed by the Technical Point of Contact.

Item No. 4. Class D Mowing Services - Bi-Annually (June & September)

Contractor shall furnish all labor, materials and equipment necessary to mow and trim the dam toe service road areas below the dam (approximately .5 acres). The specific area is delineated in this contract as the Edward MacDowell Dam Class D Mowing Services (Map 1 of 2). The mowing, trimming and grounds cleaning requirements will be utilized for this area of the work twice annually. One service will be conducted in the month of June and again in the month of September, or as directed by the Technical Point of Contact.

Item No. 5. Lawn Aeration

Contractor shall furnish all labor, materials and equipment necessary to aerate the large lawn area upstream of the dam "volleyball field" (approximately 1.2 acres). The specific area is delineated in this contract as the Edward MacDowell Dam Aeration/ Fertilization Area (Map 2 of 2). The service requirements will be utilized for this area of the work annually in the spring, and will be conducted in the month of May before the opening of the recreation season, or as directed by the Technical Point of Contact.

Item No. 6. Fertilizing

Contractor shall furnish all labor, materials and equipment necessary to fertilize the large lawn area upstream of the dam "volleyball field" (approximately 1.2 acres). The specific area is delineated in this contract as the Edward MacDowell Dam Aeration/ Fertilization Area (Map 2 of 2). The service requirements will be utilized for this area of the work annually in the fall, and will be conducted in the month of September after the close of the recreation season, or as directed by the Technical Point of Contact.

Item No. 7. & 8 Spring/ Fall Clean-Up

Contractor shall furnish all labor, tools, equipment, and supplies necessary to perform the spring and fall cleaning for the Edward MacDowell Dam mowing and maintenance areas as shown on the attached mapped locations (approximately 9.7 acres);

a. The spring cleaning will be at the first of the season, and is intended to prepare the areas for the summer season. All spring cleaning work shall occur between May 1st and May 15th of each year, unless otherwise approved by the Technical Point of Contact. The spring clean up of

mowing areas requires the contractor remove fallen tree branches, leaves, sand and other debris to prevent damage to turf. Leaves shall be mulched and all debris, tree branches, litter, etc., shall be removed from the mowing areas maintained under this contract. All materials removed from the mowing areas shall be disposed of in a proper location off project property or in a location designated by the Technical Point of Contact.

b. The fall cleaning will be at the end of the season, and is intended to prepare the areas for the winter season. All fall cleaning work shall occur between November 1st and November 25th of each year, unless otherwise approved by the Technical Point of Contact. The fall clean up of mowing areas and ditches requires the contractor remove fallen tree branches, leaves, sand and other debris to prevent damage to turf and to prevent blockage of the ditch-ways. Leaves shall be mulched and all debris, tree branches, litter, etc., shall be removed from the mowing areas maintained under this contract. All materials removed from the mowing areas shall be disposed of in a proper location off project property or in a location designated by the Technical Point of Contact.



HEALTH & WELFARE: \$4.48 per hour or \$179.20 per week or \$776.53 per month

HEALTH & WELFARE EO 13706: \$4.18 per hour, or \$167.20 per week, or \$724.53 per month*

*This rate is to be used only when compensating employees for performance on an SCA-covered contract also covered by EO 13706, Establishing Paid Sick Leave for Federal Contractors. A contractor may not receive credit toward its SCA obligations for any paid sick leave provided pursuant to EO 13706.

VACATION: 1 week paid vacation after 1 year of service with a contractor or successor; 2 weeks after 2 years; and 3 weeks after 10 years. Length of service includes the whole span of continuous service with the present contractor or successor, wherever employed, and with the predecessor contractors in the performance of similar work at the same Federal facility. (Reg. 29 CFR 4.173)

HOLIDAYS: A minimum of ten paid holidays per year: New Year's Day, Martin Luther King Jr.'s Birthday, Washington's Birthday, Memorial Day, Independence Day, Labor Day, Columbus Day, Veterans' Day, Thanksgiving Day, and Christmas Day. (A contractor may substitute for any of the named holidays another day off with pay in accordance with a plan communicated to the employees involved.) (See 29 CFR 4.174)

THE OCCUPATIONS WHICH HAVE NUMBERED FOOTNOTES IN PARENTHESES RECEIVE THE FOLLOWING:

1) COMPUTER EMPLOYEES: Under the SCA at section 8(b), this wage determination does not apply to any employee who individually qualifies as a bona fide executive, administrative, or professional employee as defined in 29 C.F.R. Part 541. Because most Computer System Analysts and Computer Programmers who are compensated at a rate not less than \$27.63 (or on a salary or fee basis at a rate not less than \$455 per week) an hour would likely qualify as exempt computer professionals, (29 C.F.R. 541. 400) wage rates may not be listed on this wage determination for all occupations within those job families. In addition, because this wage determination may not list a wage rate for some or all occupations within those job families if the survey data indicates that the prevailing wage rate for the occupation equals or exceeds \$27.63 per hour conformances may be necessary for certain nonexempt employees. For

example, if an individual employee is nonexempt but nevertheless performs duties within the scope of one of the Computer Systems Analyst or Computer Programmer occupations for which this wage determination does not specify an SCA wage rate, then the wage rate for that employee must be conformed in accordance with the conformance procedures described in the conformance note included on this wage determination.

Additionally, because job titles vary widely and change quickly in the computer industry, job titles are not determinative of the application of the computer professional exemption. Therefore, the exemption applies only to computer employees who satisfy the compensation requirements and whose primary duty consists of:

- (1) The application of systems analysis techniques and procedures, including consulting with users, to determine hardware, software or system functional specifications;
- (2) The design, development, documentation, analysis, creation, testing or modification of computer systems or programs, including prototypes, based on and related to user or system design specifications;
- (3) The design, documentation, testing, creation or modification of computer programs related to machine operating systems; or
- (4) A combination of the aforementioned duties, the performance of which requires the same level of skills. (29 C.F.R. 541.400).
- 2) AIR TRAFFIC CONTROLLERS AND WEATHER OBSERVERS NIGHT PAY & SUNDAY PAY: If you work at night as part of a regular tour of duty, you will earn a night differential and receive an additional 10% of basic pay for any hours worked between 6pm and 6am. If you are a full-time employed (40 hours a week) and Sunday is part of your regularly scheduled workweek, you are paid at your rate of basic pay plus a Sunday premium of 25% of your basic rate for each hour of Sunday work which is not overtime (i.e. occasional work on Sunday outside the normal tour of duty is considered overtime work).

** HAZARDOUS PAY DIFFERENTIAL **

An 8 percent differential is applicable to employees employed in a position that represents a high degree of hazard when working with or in close proximity to ordnance, explosives, and incendiary materials. This includes work such as screening, blending, dying, mixing, and pressing of sensitive ordnance, explosives, and pyrotechnic compositions such as lead azide, black powder and photoflash powder. All dry-house activities involving propellants or explosives. Demilitarization, modification, renovation, demolition, and maintenance operations on sensitive ordnance, explosives and incendiary materials. All operations involving re-grading and cleaning of artillery ranges.

A 4 percent differential is applicable to employees employed in a position that represents a low degree of hazard when working with, or in close proximity to ordnance, (or employees possibly adjacent to) explosives and incendiary materials

which involves potential injury such as laceration of hands, face, or arms of the employee engaged in the operation, irritation of the skin, minor burns and the like; minimal damage to immediate or adjacent work area or equipment being used. All operations involving, unloading, storage, and hauling of ordnance, explosive, and incendiary ordnance material other than small arms ammunition. These differentials are only applicable to work that has been specifically designated by the agency for ordnance, explosives, and incendiary material differential pay.

** UNIFORM ALLOWANCE **

If employees are required to wear uniforms in the performance of this contract (either by the terms of the Government contract, by the employer, by the state or local law, etc.), the cost of furnishing such uniforms and maintaining (by laundering or dry cleaning) such uniforms is an expense that may not be borne by an employee where such cost reduces the hourly rate below that required by the wage determination. The Department of Labor will accept payment in accordance with the following standards as compliance:

The contractor or subcontractor is required to furnish all employees with an adequate number of uniforms without cost or to reimburse employees for the actual cost of the uniforms. In addition, where uniform cleaning and maintenance is made the responsibility of the employee, all contractors and subcontractors subject to this wage determination shall (in the absence of a bona fide collective bargaining agreement providing for a different amount, or the furnishing of contrary affirmative proof as to the actual cost), reimburse all employees for such cleaning and maintenance at a rate of \$3.35 per week (or \$.67 cents per day). However, in those instances where the uniforms furnished are made of "wash and wear" materials, may be routinely washed and dried with other personal garments, and do not require any special treatment such as dry cleaning, daily washing, or commercial laundering in order to meet the cleanliness or appearance standards set by the terms of the Government contract, by the contractor, by law, or by the nature of the work, there is no requirement that employees be reimbursed for uniform maintenance costs.

** SERVICE CONTRACT ACT DIRECTORY OF OCCUPATIONS **

The duties of employees under job titles listed are those described in the "Service Contract Act Directory of Occupations", Fifth Edition (Revision 1), dated September 2015, unless otherwise indicated.

** REQUEST FOR AUTHORIZATION OF ADDITIONAL CLASSIFICATION AND WAGE RATE, Standard Form 1444 (SF-1444) **

Conformance Process:

The contracting officer shall require that any class of service employee which is not listed herein and which is to be employed under the contract (i.e., the work to be performed is not performed by any classification listed in the wage

determination), be classified by the contractor so as to provide a reasonable relationship (i.e., appropriate level of skill comparison) between such unlisted classifications and the classifications listed in the wage determination (See 29 CFR 4.6(b)(2)(i)). Such conforming procedures shall be initiated by the contractor prior to the performance of contract work by such unlisted class(es) of employees (See 29 CFR 4.6(b)(2)(ii)). The Wage and Hour Division shall make a final determination of conformed classification, wage rate, and/or fringe benefits which shall be paid to all employees performing in the classification from the first day of work on which contract work is performed by them in the classification. Failure to pay such unlisted employees the compensation agreed upon by the interested parties and/or fully determined by the Wage and Hour Division retroactive to the date such class of employees commenced contract work shall be a violation of the Act and this contract. (See 29 CFR 4.6(b)(2)(v)). When multiple wage determinations are included in a contract, a separate SF-1444 should be prepared for each wage determination to which a class(es) is to be conformed.

The process for preparing a conformance request is as follows:


- 1) When preparing the bid, the contractor identifies the need for a conformed occupation(s) and computes a proposed rate(s).
- 2) After contract award, the contractor prepares a written report listing in order the proposed classification title(s), a Federal grade equivalency (FGE) for each proposed classification(s), job description(s), and rationale for proposed wage rate(s), including information regarding the agreement or disagreement of the authorized representative of the employees involved, or where there is no authorized representative, the employees themselves. This report should be submitted to the contracting officer no later than 30 days after such unlisted class(es) of employees performs any contract work.
- 3) The contracting officer reviews the proposed action and promptly submits a report of the action, together with the agency's recommendations and pertinent information including the position of the contractor and the employees, to the U.S. Department of Labor, Wage and Hour Division, for review (See 29 CFR 4.6(b)(2)(ii)).
- 4) Within 30 days of receipt, the Wage and Hour Division approves, modifies, or disapproves the action via transmittal to the agency contracting officer, or notifies the contracting officer that additional time will be required to process the request.
- 5) The contracting officer transmits the Wage and Hour Division's decision to the contractor.
- 6) Each affected employee shall be furnished by the contractor with a written copy of such determination or it shall be posted as a part of the wage determination (See 29 CFR 4.6(b)(2)(iii)).

Information required by the Regulations must be submitted on SF-1444 or bond paper.

When preparing a conformance request, the "Service Contract Act Directory of Occupations" should be used to compare job definitions to ensure that duties requested are not performed by a classification already listed in the wage determination. Remember, it is not the job title, but the required tasks that determine whether a class is included in an established wage determination. Conformances may not be used to artificially split, combine, or subdivide classifications listed in the wage determination (See 29 CFR 4.152(c)(1)).


