A. GENERAL

1. **Scope**

Provide all equipment, materials, labor, and transportation necessary to perform snow removal and sanding activities at three separate locations at the Colebrook River Lake Project. Location #1 – Office: Main Entrance and Roadway to Spillway Parking Lot, Lower Access Gate Entrance and Roadway, Lower (green) Utility Garage area, Project Office area, Blue Utility Garage driveway, Boat House Driveway and three Off-Season Parking Lots. Location #2 – Boat Launch: Boat Launch Entrance. Location #3 – North End: North End Entrance. Located in Colebrook, CT. and Sandisfield, MA.

2. Locations

Location #1 – Office - is located at 426 A Colebrook River Road Colebrook, CT. Location #2 – Boat Launch – is located 1.5 miles North of the Office on Route 8. Location #3 – North End – is located 5.5 miles North of the Office on Route 8 in Sandisfield, MA.

4. Schedule

5. Safety Requirements

a. **General**:

All work shall be conducted in accordance with the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers Safety and Health Requirements Manual (EM 385-1-1, most recent edition), and all applicable Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA), federal, state, and local safety, and health requirements. A copy of EM 385-1-1 can be accessed at the project office or electronically at the following link:

Project staff reserve the right to cease work at any time should the safety of employees, Contractors, and/or the public become jeopardized.

COVID 19:

Procedures shall be documented in the Abbreviated Accident Prevention Plan and in the appropriate AHA's to address site specific COVID-19 monitoring procedure which address at the minimum, the following items:

- Contractor shall provide employees with and require them to use all required COVID-19 related Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) in accordance with Center of Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) and state guidelines.
- Procedures shall be in place for periodic sanitation inspections and disinfecting of project sites and work areas in accordance with CDC guidelines.
- Site specific procedures shall be in place to practice and promote appropriate social distancing while on site when such procedure is practical.
 Employees shall be trained in signs, symptoms, and protection measures in accordance with CDC guidelines.

b. Abbreviated Accident Prevention Plan:

The Contractor shall prepare an Abbreviated Accident Prevention Plan (APP) specific to the activities being performed. It shall include Activity Hazard Analyses (AHAs) as described below. A non-mandatory, fillable Abbreviated APP template is available upon request. However, the contractor is permitted to submit their own plan, at a minimum it must meet the requirements of EM 385-1-1, Appendix A, Section K.

A preparatory meeting shall be conducted by the prime contractor to discuss the Abbreviated APP contents with all effected onsite employees. The Prime Contractor is responsible for informing their subcontractors of the safety provisions under the terms of the contract, the penalties for noncompliance, and inspecting subcontractor operations to ensure that accident prevention responsibilities are being carried out.

c. Activity Hazard Analysis (AHA):

An AHA shall be submitted for each major phase of work. A major phase of work is defined as an operation involving a type of work presenting hazards not experienced in previous operations or where a new subcontractor or work crew is to perform the work. The analysis shall define all activities to be performed, identify the sequence of work, the specific hazards anticipated, and the control measures to be implemented to eliminate or reduce each hazard to an acceptable level. The AHA shall be continuously reviewed and revised to address changing site conditions as appropriate.

d. **Emergency Response:**

Emergency procedures shall be documented in the Abbreviated Accident Prevention Plan and will include a map with directions to the nearest hospital, emergency contact numbers, and onsite First Aid/CPR responders.

e. Required Personnel:

The Contractor shall designate one employee as the site's Competent Person (CP) who is responsible for ensuring a safe environment for all employees. The CP shall be present at the project site and report to the contractor's upper management. The CP is required to have related construction and/or service experience.

When emergency medical services are not accessible within five minutes of the work location and there are two or more workers onsite, at least two employees shall be trained in First Aid and CPR. Minimum qualifications are listed in EM 385-1-1, Section 03.A.02.c.

f. Accident Reporting:

All accidents and near misses shall be investigated by the Contractor. All work-related recordable injuries, illnesses, and property damage accidents (excluding on-the-road vehicle accidents), in which the property damage exceeds \$5,000.00, shall be verbally reported to the Technical Point of Contact (TPOC) within four hours of the incident. Serious accidents as described in EM 385-1-1 Section 01.D shall be immediately reported to the TPOC. ENG Form 3394 shall be completed and submitted to the TPOC within five working days of the incident.

The Contractor shall compile employee work hours (including subcontractors) and forward the total hours to the TPOC no later than close of business on the 10th calendar day of the following month. The method of transmission by the prime contractor to the TPOC shall be electronically.

6. Pre-Work Conference

The Contractor, upon award of this contract, shall contact the Technical Point of Contact to arrange a pre-work conference. At this meeting, contract requirements will be discussed, and any problems resolved. The successful vendor is required to attend this pre-work conference.

The following is a general list of items for discussion during this Pre-work Conference:

- i. Authority of the Technical Point of Contact.
- ii. Contractor's Safety Program.
- iii. Activity Hazard Analysis (Submitted & accepted prior to start of work on site).
- iv. Requirements for Safety Meetings (Documented on NED Form 251).
- v. Accident Reporting (ENG Form 3394).
- vi. Accident Exposure Hours Reporting requirements
- vii. Material Safety Data Sheet (MSDS) requirements.
- viii. Contractor's Quality Control Plan.
- ix. Administrative, Communications and Correspondence Procedures.
- x. Invoice and payment.

7. **Permits**

The Contractor shall, without additional expense to the Government, be responsible for obtaining any necessary licenses, permits, and letters of certification. The Contractor shall comply with any applicable Federal, State, County, and Municipal laws, codes, and regulations in connection with the performance of the work specified under this contract.

8. **Security**

The contractor will comply with all established security policies at Colebrook River Lake. Due to periods of heightened security that may affect the access to the areas covered under this contract, areas may be subject to periodic closures, which in turn may reduce or inhibit the Contractor's ability to access certain areas. During periods of heightened security, the Government reserves the right, at any time, to close any property or portion of property and reschedule and/or cancel any subsequent service in an area. The Contractor shall be given at least 24 hours notice of any such closure.

9. Contractor Personnel

a. Minimum Personnel Requirements

The Contractor shall provide an adequate number of fully qualified personnel to perform the specified service properly and efficiently within the time limits specified. The Contractor shall provide a list of the names and contact phone numbers for all employees prior to them working on Government Property.

b. Employee Conduct

The Contractor shall be responsible for seeing that the firm's employees strictly comply withal Federal (including CFR 36), State, and Municipal laws. Any personnel activity, which, in the opinion of the Government, is deemed detrimental to the performance of the contract may result in the removal of Contractor employee/employees.

- Examples of unbecoming actions or conduct include but are not limited to the following:
- Cursing, harassment, or discrimination of and/or unwarranted physical contact with visitors, U.S. Army Corps of Engineers personnel, or other contractors
- Recurring written and/or verbal complaints from visitors, U.S. Army Corps of Engineers personnel, or other contractors.
- Unsafe operation of vehicles while on U.S. Army Corps of Engineers property.

c. Removal of Contractor's Employees

The Technical Point of Contact may require the Contractor to immediately remove from the work site any employee of the Contractor or subcontractor, who, in the opinion of the Technical Point of Contact, is incompetent, who endangers persons or property, or whose physical or mental condition is such that it would impair the employee's ability to satisfactorily perform assigned work. Notification to the Contractor shall be promptly made in writing if time and circumstances permit. Otherwise, notification shall be verbal or by telephone, and shall be confirmed in writing as soon as possible. No such removal, however, will reduce the Contractor's obligation to perform all work required under this

contract, and immediate replacement will be made as required. This requirement shall not be made the basis of any claim for compensation or damages against the United States or any of its officers or agents.

10. Payment

B. TECHNICAL

General

Provide all equipment, materials, labor, and transportation necessary to provide snow removal and sand/salt mix services. The snow removal services include four separate tasks at three project areas for four different storm events. The services include Snow Plowing, Sanding and Salting, and Maintenance Plowing. The services shall be performed at the Colebrook River Lake Project Office, Colebrook River Lake Boat Launch entrance and Colebrook River Lake North End entrance as shown in maps 1-7. The services shall include storms that are "1-inch to 6-inches", "6-inches to 12- inches", "12-inches to 24-inches" and "Greater than 24-inches". Contractor's work and responsibility shall include, but not be limited to, all job planning, programming, scheduling, administration, inspection, personnel, equipment, vehicles, fuel, materials, supplies, supervision, and quality control necessary to perform the various services required herein.

Materials & Supplies

- The following materials shall be provided by Contractor:
 - Sand/Salt mix (for plowed areas). Note Mixture will have a maximum salt content of 20%
 - o Walkway salt. (pet, concrete, and turf friendly)
 - o Warming device to thaw frozen locks. (small hand torch recommended)

Note: The Contractor shall submit Safety Data Sheet for each chemical or product proposed for use. All products will be reviewed as a submittal and accepted by the Technical POC.

Equipment

- The contractor is required to have equipment sufficient to plow snow and to sand. The equipment should be able to handle heavy snow loads from normal falling snow, ice, rain, and drifted snow. The equipment should be able to broadcast the snow to avoid encroaching snowbanks.
- The minimum equipment shall include
 - o 3/4 ton four-wheel drive truck
 - o 8-foot plow, equipped with four way angling capabilities.
 - o A sander with a minimum one-yard capacity.

Service Description

1. **Snow Plowing:** The following services shall be performed as part of the Snow Plowing:

- A. Snow plowing will be required after accumulation of two inches or more of snow, or upon notification by project staff after hours and weekends only.
- B. Snow will be pushed and stored in the designated areas shown on maps 1-7.
- C. The Contractor will make sure to safely push back all banks along roadways and entry points to maintain easy access. All access shall be a minimum of sixteen (16) feet in width. No snow will be pushed in front of or block any access gates.
- D. While plowing the diversion dam all snow shall be thrown to the South side due to wind drifting. While plowing the main dam all snow shall be thrown to the South side (downstream) side due to wind drifting.
- E. Plowing will be performed on weekends, holidays, and after normal working hours during the week to maintain access during storm events.

F. Site Access

- a. The contractor will be provided a key for access to the Colebrook River Lake Project Office gates and lower access gate.
- b. If the contractor is required to unlock and open a gate to plow, then the contractor will be required to secure the gate when the plowing is completed, unless project personnel are present.
- c. The Contractor may have to use a warming device (hand torch) to thaw frozen locks to gain access to areas in this contract.
- d. Upon the completion of this contract, the contractor will return the keys to the project staff before final payment is made.

G. Property Damage

- a. In the event that property is damaged, it is the Contractor's responsibility to immediately notify the Technical Point of Contact to report the damage.
- b. It will be the responsibility of the Contractor to coordinate with the Technical Point of Contact an appropriate way to repair damaged property at no cost to the Government.
- 2. **Sanding and Salting:** The following services shall be performed as part of the Sanding and Salting:
 - A. The TPOC shall be contacted to confirm that sanding/salting is required **prior** to performing these services.
 - B. In the event that roadways and parking areas become icy or hazardous, the contractor shall spread an appropriate and adequate amount of sand/salt mixture over plowed areas.
 - C. The project staff may request additional sanding and salting as conditions require.
 - D. Sanding and salting will also be performed on weekends, holidays, and after normal working hours during the week if necessary.
- 3. **Maintenance Plowing:** The following services shall be performed as part of the Maintenance Plowing:
 - A. "Maintenance Plowing" may occur every two inches as deemed necessary by Project staff, to avoid hazardous conditions.
 - B. "Maintenance Plowing" shall include all plowing services at the Colebrook River Lake Project Office, Colebrook River Lake Boat Launch entrance and Colebrook River Lake North End entrance.

C. If the Government Technical Point of Contact requests additional plowing services, that work shall be considered a separate service and invoiced as such.

Storm Events

The scope of services includes four storm events and are as following:

- 1. **1-inch to 6-inches** Storm events total less than six (6) inches.
- 2. **6-inches to 12-inches** Storm events of at least six (6) inches and up to (and including) twelve (12) inches.
- 3. **12-inches to 24-inches** Storm events of at least twelve (12) inches and up to (and including) twenty-four (24) inches.





HEALTH & WELFARE EO 13706: \$4.23 per hour up to 40 hours per week or \$169.20 per week or \$733.20 per month*

*This rate is to be used only when compensating employees for performance on an SCA-covered contract also covered by EO 13706 Establishing Paid Sick Leave for Federal Contractors. A contractor may not receive credit toward its SCA obligations for any paid sick leave provided pursuant to EO 13706.

VACATION: 2 weeks paid vacation after 1 year of service with a contractor or successor; 3 weeks after 5 years 4 weeks after 15 years and 5 weeks after 25 years. Length of service includes the whole span of continuous service with the present contractor or successor wherever employed and with the predecessor contractors in the performance of similar work at the same Federal facility. THE OCCUPATIONS WHICH HAVE NUMBERED FOOTNOTES IN PARENTHESES RECEIVE THE FOLLOWING:

1) COMPUTER EMPLOYEES: Under the SCA at section 8(b) this wage determination does not apply to any employee who individually qualifies as a bona fide executive administrative or professional employee as defined in 29 C.F.R. Part 541. Because most Computer System Analysts and Computer Programmers who are compensated at a rate not less than \$27.63 (or on a salary or fee basis at a rate not less than \$455 per week) an hour would likely qualify as exempt computer professionals (29 C.F.R. 541. 400) wage rates may not be listed on this wage determination for all occupations within those job families. In addition because this wage determination may not list a wage rate for some or all occupations within those job families if the survey data indicates that the prevailing wage rate for the occupation equals or exceeds \$27.63 per hour conformances may be necessary for certain nonexempt employees. For example if an individual employee is nonexempt but nevertheless performs duties within the scope of one of the Computer Systems Analyst or Computer Programmer occupations for which this wage determination does not specify an SCA wage rate then the wage rate for that employee must be conformed in accordance with the conformance procedures described in the conformance note included on this wage determination.

Additionally because job titles vary widely and change quickly in the computer industry job titles are not determinative of the application of the computer professional exemption. Therefore the exemption applies only to computer employees who satisfy the compensation requirements and whose primary duty consists of:

- (1) The application of systems analysis techniques and procedures including consulting with users to determine hardware software or system functional specifications;
- (2) The design development documentation analysis creation testing or modification of computer systems or programs including prototypes based on and related to user or system design specifications;
 - (3) The design documentation testing creation or modification of computer

programs related to machine operating systems; or

(4) A combination of the aforementioned duties the performance of which requires the same level of skills. (29 C.F.R. 541.400).

2) AIR TRAFFIC CONTROLLERS AND WEATHER OBSERVERS - NIGHT PAY & SUNDAY PAY: If you

work at night as part of a regular tour of duty you will earn a night differential and receive an additional 10% of basic pay for any hours worked between 6pm and 6am. If you are a full-time employed (40 hours a week) and Sunday is part of your regularly scheduled workweek you are paid at your rate of basic pay plus a Sunday premium of 25% of your basic rate for each hour of Sunday work which is not overtime (i.e. occasional work on Sunday outside the normal tour of duty is considered overtime work).

** HAZARDOUS PAY DIFFERENTIAL **

An 8 percent differential is applicable to employees employed in a position that represents a high degree of hazard when working with or in close proximity to ordnance explosives and incendiary materials. This includes work such as screening blending dying mixing and pressing of sensitive ordnance explosives and pyrotechnic compositions such as lead azide black powder and photoflash powder. All dry-house activities involving propellants or explosives. Demilitarization modification renovation demolition and maintenance operations on sensitive ordnance explosives and incendiary materials. All operations involving re-grading and cleaning of artillery ranges.

A 4 percent differential is applicable to employees employed in a position that represents a low degree of hazard when working with or in close proximity to ordnance (or employees possibly adjacent to) explosives and incendiary materials which involves potential injury such as laceration of hands face or arms of the employee engaged in the operation irritation of the skin minor burns and the like; minimal damage to immediate or adjacent work area or equipment being used. All operations involving unloading storage and hauling of ordnance explosive and incendiary ordnance material other than small arms ammunition. These differentials are only applicable to work that has been specifically designated by the agency for

ordnance explosives and incendiary material differential pay.

** UNIFORM ALLOWANCE **

If employees are required to wear uniforms in the performance of this contract (either by the terms of the Government contract by the employer by the state or local law etc.) the cost of furnishing such uniforms and maintaining (by laundering or dry cleaning) such uniforms is an expense that may not be borne by an employee where such cost reduces the hourly rate below that required by the wage determination. The Department of Labor will accept payment in accordance with the following standards as compliance:

The contractor or subcontractor is required to furnish all employees with an adequate number of uniforms without cost or to reimburse employees for the actual cost of the uniforms. In addition where uniform cleaning and maintenance is made the responsibility of the employee all contractors and subcontractors subject to this wage determination shall (in the absence of a bona fide collective bargaining agreement providing for a different amount or the furnishing of contrary affirmative proof as to the actual cost) reimburse all employees for such cleaning and maintenance at a rate of \$3.35 per week (or \$.67 cents per day). However in those instances where the uniforms furnished are made of ""wash and wear"" materials may be routinely washed and dried with other personal garments and do not require any special treatment such as dry cleaning daily washing or commercial laundering in order to meet the cleanliness or appearance standards set by the terms of the Government contract by the contractor by law or by the nature of the work there is no requirement that employees be reimbursed for uniform maintenance costs.

** SERVICE CONTRACT ACT DIRECTORY OF OCCUPATIONS **

The duties of employees under job titles listed are those described in the ""Service Contract Act Directory of Occupations"" Fifth Edition (Revision 1) dated September 2015 unless otherwise indicated.

** REQUEST FOR AUTHORIZATION OF ADDITIONAL CLASSIFICATION AND WAGE RATE Standard Form 1444 (SF-1444) **

Conformance Process:

The contracting officer shall require that any class of service employee which is not listed herein and which is to be employed under the contract (i.e. the work to be performed is not performed by any classification listed in the wage determination) be classified by the contractor so as to provide a reasonable relationship (i.e. appropriate level of skill comparison) between such unlisted classifications and the classifications listed in the wage determination (See 29 CFR 4.6(b)(2)(i)). Such conforming procedures shall be initiated by the contractor prior to the performance of contract work by such unlisted class(es) of employees (See 29 CFR 4.6(b)(2)(ii)). The Wage and Hour Division shall make a final determination of conformed classification wage rate and/or fringe benefits which shall be paid to all employees performing in the classification from the first day of work on which contract work is performed by them in the classification. Failure to pay such unlisted employees the compensation agreed upon by the interested parties and/or fully determined by the Wage and Hour Division retroactive to the date such class of employees commenced contract work shall be a violation of the Act and this contract. (See 29 CFR 4.6(b)(2)(v)). When multiple wage determinations are included in a contract a separate SF-1444 should be prepared for each wage determination to which a class(es) is to be conformed.

The process for preparing a conformance request is as follows:

- 1) When preparing the bid the contractor identifies the need for a conformed occupation(s) and computes a proposed rate(s).
- 2) After contract award the contractor prepares a written report listing in order the proposed classification title(s) a Federal grade equivalency (FGE) for each proposed classification(s) job description(s) and rationale for proposed wage rate(s) including information regarding the agreement or disagreement of the authorized representative of the employees involved or where there is no authorized representative the employees themselves. This report should be submitted to the

contracting officer no later than 30 days after such unlisted class(es) of employees performs any contract work.

- 3) The contracting officer reviews the proposed action and promptly submits a report of the action together with the agency's recommendations and pertinent information including the position of the contractor and the employees to the U.S. Department of Labor Wage and Hour Division for review (See 29 CFR 4.6(b)(2)(ii)).
- 4) Within 30 days of receipt the Wage and Hour Division approves modifies or disapproves the action via transmittal to the agency contracting officer or notifies the contracting officer that additional time will be required to process the request.
- 5) The contracting officer transmits the Wage and Hour Division's decision to the contractor.
- 6) Each affected employee shall be furnished by the contractor with a written copy of such determination or it shall be posted as a part of the wage determination (See 29 CFR 4.6(b)(2)(iii)).

Information required by the Regulations must be submitted on SF-1444 or bond paper.

When preparing a conformance request the ""Service Contract Act Directory of Occupations"" should be used to compare job definitions to ensure that duties requested are not performed by a classification already listed in the wage determination. Remember it is not the job title but the required tasks that determine whether a class is included in an established wage determination. Conformances may not be used to artificially split combine or subdivide classifications listed in the wage determination (See 29 CFR 4.152(c)(1))."
