I. GENERAL

1. Scope of work

The purpose of this contract is to provide U.S. Army Corps of Engineers Fee Property Boundary identification, clearing and marking of approximately four (4) miles with sixty six (66) monuments at the West Hill Dam property north of Mendon Road. The contractor shall furnish all labor, equipment, transportation, and materials necessary to execute the boundary identification, clearing and marking services.

While performing boundary maintenance, the contractor will keep an ongoing written report of all findings including missing monuments, damaged monuments, monuments that couldn't be located, trespasses, encroachments, etc. including photographic evidence to be submitted upon completion of the contract. A photo album of every monument located will be included with the final report.

2. Location

The required services shall be performed at the West Hill Dam property north of Mendon Road located in the towns of Northbridge and Upton, Massachusetts.

3. Site Visit

4. Schedule

The period of performance is 120 days and will begin on the day of contract award. The Pre-Work Conference shall be completed within 14 days of contract award, and safety paperwork shall be submitted, reviewed, and accepted within 30 days of contract award. Field work shall begin no later than 30 days after contract award. Work will not be permitted before 7:00 am or after 3:30 pm, or on Saturdays, Sundays or Government holidays unless approved in advance by the Technical Point of Contact.

5. **Safety**

The contractor will comply with all pertinent provisions of the latest edition of the *U.S. Army Corps of Engineers Safety and Health Requirements* COE EM 385-1-1. The manual may be viewed at the following link:

http://www.publications.usace.army.mil/Portals/76/Publications/EngineerManuals/EM_385-1-1.pdf. The contractor shall also comply with all Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) work safety standards.

Project staff reserve the right to cease work at any time should the safety of employees, contractors, and/or the public become jeopardized.

a. Abbreviated Accident Prevention Plan:

The contractor shall prepare an Abbreviated Accident Prevention Plan (AAPP) specific to the activities being performed. It shall include Activity Hazard Analyses (AHAs) as described below. A non-mandatory, fillable Abbreviated APP template is available upon request. However, the contractor is permitted to submit their own plan, at a minimum it must meet the requirements of EM 385-1-1, Appendix A, Section K.

A preparatory meeting shall be conducted by the prime contractor to discuss the Abbreviated APP contents with all effected onsite employees. The Prime Contractor is responsible for informing their subcontractors of the safety provisions under the terms of the contract, the penalties for noncompliance, and inspecting subcontractor operations to ensure that accident prevention responsibilities are being carried out.

b. Activity Hazard Analysis:

An AHA shall be submitted for each major phase of work. A major phase of work is defined as an operation involving a type of work presenting hazards not experienced in previous operations or where a new subcontractor or work crew is to perform the work. The analysis shall define all activities to be performed, identify the sequence of work, the specific hazards anticipated, and the control measures to be implemented to eliminate or reduce each hazard to an acceptable level. The AHA shall be continuously reviewed and revised to address changing site conditions as appropriate.

COVID-19 NOTE: As part of the AAPP and AHA's, include site specific COVID-19 monitoring procedures which address, at a minimum, the following elements:

- Procedures for periodic sanitation inspections.
- Procedures for disinfecting project sites in accordance with Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) guidelines.
- Site specific measures to practice social distancing while working on the project.

- Employee training on the signs, symptoms, and protection measures in accordance with CDC guidelines.
- A list of Personal Protective Equipment to be used in accordance with CDC and state guidelines.

c. Emergency Response:

Emergency procedures shall be documented in the Abbreviated Accident Prevention Plan and will include a map with directions to the nearest hospital, emergency contact numbers, and onsite First Aid/CPR responders.

d. Required Personnel:

The contractor shall designate one employee as the site's Competent Person (CP) who is responsible for ensuring a safe environment for all employees. The CP shall be present at the project site and report to the contractor's upper management. The CP is required to have related construction and/or service experience.

When emergency medical services are not accessible within five (5) minutes of the work location and there are two (2) or more workers onsite, at least two (2) employees shall be trained in First Aid and CPR. Minimum qualifications are listed in EM 385-1-1, Section 03.A.02.c.

e. Accident Reporting:

All accidents and near misses shall be investigated by the contractor. All work-related recordable injuries, illnesses, and property damage accidents (excluding on-the-road vehicle accidents), in which the property damage exceeds \$5,000.00, shall be verbally reported to the TPOC within four (4) hours of the incident. Serious accidents as described in EM 385-1-1 Section 01.D shall be immediately reported to the TPOC. ENG Form 3394 shall be completed and submitted to the TPOC within five (5) working days of the incident.

The contractor shall compile employee work hours (including subcontractors) and forward the total hours to the TPOC no later than close of business on the 10th calendar day of the following month. The method of transmission by the prime contractor to the TPOC shall be electronically.

6. Pre-Work Conference

Prior to the start of any work, the Technical Point of Contact will schedule and conduct a prework conference. The contractor's Project Manager and Quality Control Personnel shall attend this meeting. This conference will be held at the time and location agreeable to the Government and contractor. No work shall be performed under this contract prior to this conference. The purpose of the conference is to enable the Technical Point of Contact to outline the procedures that will be followed by the Government in its administration of the contract, and to discuss the performance that will be expected from the contractor. This conference will allow the contractor an opportunity to ask questions about the Government's administration and inspection of contract work or obtain other pertinent information that might be required. At the pre work-conference the contractor shall provide the name of the project superintendent with a telephone number for project coordination.

The following is a general list of items for discussion during this pre-work conference:

- i. Authority of the Technical Point of Contact and Quality Assurance Inspectors
- ii. Contractor's Safety Program (including sub-contractors)
- iii. Abbreviated Accident Prevention Plan

- vi. Accident Reporting (ENG Form 3394)
- vii. Safety Data Sheet (SDS) requirements
- viii. Correspondence, Communication and Administrative Procedures
 - ix. Ongoing status reports and quality and content of the final report
 - x. Invoice and payment

7. Permits

The contractor shall, without additional expense to the Government, be responsible for obtaining any necessary licenses, permits, and letters of certification. The contractor shall comply with all applicable federal, state, county, and municipal laws, codes, and regulations in connection with the performance of the work specified under this contract.

8. Security

The contractor will comply with all established security policies at all projects. Due to periods of heightened security that may affect the access to the areas covered under this contract, areas may be subject to periodic closures, which in turn may reduce or inhibit the contractor's ability to access certain areas. During periods of heightened security, the Government reserves the right, at any time, to close any property or portion of property and reschedule and/or cancel any subsequent service in an area. The contractor shall be given at least 24 hour notice of any such closure.

9. Contractor Conduct

The contractor and employees shall not use or be under the influence of drugs or alcohol at any time while performing the obligations under this contract or giving the public the appearance of same. Firearms are prohibited on project grounds. Contractor and employees must comply with CFR Title 36 Rules and Regulations.

10. Required Personnel

The contractor shall designate one employee as the site's Competent Person (CP) who is responsible for ensuring a safe environment for all employees. The CP shall be present at the project site and report to the contractor's upper management. The CP is required to have related construction and/or service experience.

11. Sustainability

II. TECHNICAL REQUIREMENTS:

Part 1 General:

1.1 Summary:

Boundary lines are maintained lines of sight to ensure abutters are aware of federal boundary lines on U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (USACE) property. Maintenance to clear these lines requires brush removal, tree marking, adding and/or replacing signage, as well as providing a written report of all findings including missing monuments, monuments that couldn't be located, trespasses, encroachments, etc. containing photographic evidence to be submitted upon completion of the contract. A photo album of every monument located will be included in the final report.

1.2 Location:

1.2.1 The contract is for the completion of boundary specifications on the section of the West Hill Dam property located north of the Mendon Road in the Towns of Northbridge and Upton, MA. This covers a total distance of approximately 4.0 linear miles.

1.3 Existing Conditions:

For all sections of boundary lines included in this contract, the contractor may anticipate overgrown brush/small trees, fallen trees, rough terrain, non-existing or faded marking paint, and broken or missing signage. Boundary monuments are assumed to be intact but may be difficult to locate.

1.4 Requests for Information:

Requests concerning the contract should be directed to the Technical Point of Contact.

1.5 Submittals:

Although the Government technically reviews submissions required by this Scope of Work, it is emphasized that the contractor's work must be prosecuted using proper internal controls and review procedures.

The documents identified below must be prepared in accordance with the applicable standards, submitted for review and accepted by the Government **prior** to the commencement of any field activities.

- 1.5.1 Abbreviated Accident Prevention Plan
- 1.5.2 Activity Hazard Analysis
- 1.5.3 Marking paint specifications and safety data sheets.

The documents identified below must be submitted **during** the period of performance of this contract:

1.5.4 A written report with photographic evidence and associated map documenting any encroachment or suspected encroachment observed. This is to be <u>immediately</u> reported to the Technical Point of Contact.

At the **conclusion** of the contract, the Contractor shall submit:

- 1.5.5 A written final report of all findings including missing monuments, monuments that couldn't be located, damaged monuments, trespasses, encroachments, maps, etc. including photographic evidence
- a. A photo album including a picture of every boundary monument located, including broken and/or damaged monuments will be included in this report
- b. Contractor will provide a paper document as well as a DVD of these final reports.

1.6 Clean Up:

The contractor shall practice good housekeeping to maintain a safe job site. The contractor shall keep the work area, including any storage areas, free from the accumulation of waste materials. Upon completing work in an area, the contractor shall remove any tools, equipment, and materials that are not the property of the Government.

Upon completion of work, the contractor shall clean up the job site to the satisfaction of the Government.

1.7 Government Resources:

The contractor is responsible for providing all materials and equipment to complete the project, except the Government furnished supplies listed in section 2.7.2 Government Furnished Materials & Supplies, which consist of aluminum nails, BLM-01 type signs, and fiberglass stakes with USACE Boundary decals. Unless specified in the contract, the Government will not provide any water, electricity, telephone services or other resources.

1.8 Omissions:

This contract may not cover all specified activities, steps, and procedures required to supply the contract product. In case of omission, the normal industry, state or federal standards, practices, specifications, and/or guides shall prevail. In no instance shall an omission be reason to produce less than an acceptable and functional product.

1.9 Quality Assurance:

The contractor is responsible for the quality control of the contract work. The Government has the right to inspect and test all items called for by the contract, to the extent practicable at all times and at all places during the term of the contract.

1.10 Other Contracts:

The Government may undertake or award other contracts for additional work not related to this contract, and the contractor shall fully cooperate with other contractors and Government employees. The contractor shall not commit or permit any act, which will interfere with the performance of work by another contractor or by Government employees.

1.11 Receiving and Storing Materials:

The contractor is responsible for protecting any stored materials until they are placed in service. The contractor is responsible for receiving and unloading delivered goods. Government employees will not receive materials or supplies for the contractor and will not be responsible for damage to contractor equipment or materials.

1.12 Equipment

- 1.12.1 Condition of Equipment All equipment used to perform work under this contract must be in good operating and mechanical condition and comply with EM 385-1-1, Army Corps of Engineers Safety and Health Requirements.
- 1.12.2 Type of Equipment Chainsaws, overhead chainsaws, motorized brush cutters, metal detector, pruners and forestry paint applicator may be required throughout the execution of the contract.
- 1.12.3 Equipment Storage No Government space or facilities shall be provided for storage under this contract.

Part 2 Service Requirements:

Boundary lines are maintained lines of site to ensure abutters are aware of federal boundary lines on United States Army Corps of Engineers (USACE) projects. Maintenance to clear these lines requires routine identification, clearing, painting, signing, reporting encroachments (documenting via photo), and reporting broken or missing monuments.

2.1 Identification of Boundary

- 2.1.1 Contractor will receive detailed maps and information of service areas from the USACE upon contract award. Maps will not be released to the public and must be returned after work has been accepted. Services performed under this contract are to be based on boundary surveyed data as indicated on maps furnished to the contractor by USACE.
- 2.1.1.1 The detailed boundary survey maps indicate the location of project boundary monuments and the distances and bearings of the property lines.
- 2.1.1.2 At the end of the contract period of performance all maps furnished to the contractor shall be returned to the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers.
- 2.1.1.3 Maps will contain locations of county, town, streets, USACE tracts and monuments within boundary line service area.
- 2.1.1.4 Contractor will identify the true USACE boundary prior to clearing and marking, which may require the use of temporary flagging for boundary line accuracy. Any flagging used will be removed by the contractor prior to completion of the contract.

2.2 Clearing of Boundary Lines

- 2.2.1 Contractor will clear/maintain a four foot wide, from U.S. Government boundary, by eight feet high line of site by cutting all branches, trees three inches (3") diameter and under at breast height (DBH), and brush/fallen trees intruding into this line; stumps will be cut no higher than three inches (3") above the ground (see Figure No. 1).
- 2.2.2 Branches will be cut back to the main stem of the tree/shrub.
- 2.2.3 Clearing is not required where the bound is defined by roads, hedges, stone walls, fences, streams, or bodies of water.
- 2.2.4 All cuttings will be disposed onto USACE property and not left hung up in trees or placed on abutters' property.

2.3 Marking of Boundary Line, Monument and Corner Trees, Bounds

- 2.3.1 Permanent boundary lines shall be marked by repainting old blazes, replacing old blazes on dead or dying trees on adjacent healthy tree, or adding additional blazes where needed so that the blazes are visible from one blaze to the next. Blazes shall be made by scraping rough outer bark from the tree leaving a smooth paintable surface consisting of a three inch wide by six inch high vertical strip. Bark shall not be removed so deeply as to expose live wood (see Figure No. 2).
- 2.3.2 Marking Boundary Line Blaze
 - 2.3.2.1 Marking Line Boundary Blaze shall be made by painting the closest tree within the four feet boundary clearing, approximately five feet above the

- ground, with an RED 6" horizontal blaze painted over a WHITE 6" horizontal blaze.
- 2.3.2.2 Trees to be blazed shall be greater than four inches in diameter at breast height (dbh) and shall be either on the boundary line or on government property within four feet of the boundary line.
- 2.3.2.3 Signs will be placed on closest tree within the four feet boundary clearing, at a height of approximately five feet and facing outward from Government property. Boundary line signs (BLM-01 type) will be placed as close to the boundary line as possible. Signs should face away from the project land being marked. Signs should be placed (where terrain, vegetation, and common sense permit) so that a least two of the signs can be clearly viewed by and individual approaching the government property line from any point on adjacent property, generally between 75 and 150 feet apart.
- 2.3.2.4 In open or lightly wooded areas, where a painted blaze is not possible, an integrated U.S. Government supplied fiberglass stake with decal "Boundary Line" shall be placed in the ground at or near the boundary line (see Figure No. 2).
- 2.3.3 Marking Boundary Monument and Corner Blaze
 - 2.3.3.1 Marking Monument and Corner Blazes shall be made by painting closest tree, within the four feet boundary clearing on Government property, approximately five feet above the ground, with an RED horizontal band painted over a WHITE horizontal band around the circumference of the tree (See Figures No. 1 & 2).
 - 2.3.3.2 Boundary Monuments will receive ORANGE paint on top.
 - 2.3.3.3 Every monument, a fiberglass stake shall be installed, with decal "Boundary Line", set next to the monument. Type of boundary monument varies (aluminum/brass/bronze disk, drill holes, concrete marker, etc.) and will be identified on maps provided by the USACE.
 - 2.3.3.4 Blazes, signs, and stakes shall be made to be seen as entering USACE property and installed only on USACE property.
 - 2.3.3.5 Paint and all supplies to perform this contract, other than listed as U.S. Government supplied, will be supplied by the contractor.

2.4 Monument Inspection and Documentation

- 2.4.1.1 Contractor shall be responsible to use a metal detector, where appropriate, to locate monuments that may not be immediately visible.
- 2.4.2 Every monument will be marked with a government supplied fiberglass stake. The fiberglass stake will be labeled "Boundary Line".
- 2.4.3 ALL monuments will be painted with ORANGE colored tree marking paint.
- 2.4.4 Contractor will provide the Technical Point of Contact documented conditions of all monuments on site with notes and photos of each monument. Contractor shall make note of any missing, damaged, or incorrect monument identification on provided maps.

2.5 Encroachment Reporting

2.5.1 Contractor will provide a photo album with pictures of possible encroachment, and indicate where the encroachment is on provided maps with a brief description of each encroachment and include this information in the final report.

- 2.5.2 Discovery of encroachments and suspected encroachments are to be <u>immediately</u> reported to the Technical Point of Contact throughout the course of the contract.
- 2.5.3 The contractor SHALL NOT attempt to resolve any encroachments.

2.6 Restrictions

All work will be inspected by the contractor's Quality Control Inspector as boundary line maintenance commences. The contractor shall notify Technical Point of Contact immediately upon completion of services, so that the Army Corps of Engineers may inspect the work. The contractor shall be responsible for correction of any and all deficiencies discovered by the Quality Assurance inspection. These correction(s) will be at no additional cost to the Government.

2.7 **Supply Descriptions**

2.7.1 Contractor Furnished Paint

The contractor shall furnish marking paint required to complete the performance work statement. The paint must be approved in advance by the technical point of contact.

- 2.7.1.1 Tree Marking Paint Supply Specification
 - 2.7.1.1.1 Provide a 6-8 year permanent duration
 - 2.7.1.1.2 Applied either by brush or forestry marking spray applicator
 - 2.7.1.1.3 Orange, red and white in color, color to be pre-approved by technical point of contact
 - 2.7.1.1.4 Paint will be oil base for durability

2.7.2 Government Furnished Materials and Supplies

Government-Furnished Materials and Supplies, for the execution of this contract, will be made available when requested in accordance with the list of Government Furnished Materials and Supplies below.





Because most Computer System Analysts and Computer Programmers who are compensated at a rate not less than \$27.63 (or on a salary or fee basis at a rate not less than \$455 per week) an hour would likely qualify as exempt computer professionals (29 C.F.R. 541. 400) wage rates may not be listed on this wage determination for all occupations within those job families. In addition because this wage determination may not list a wage rate for some or all occupations within those job families if the survey data indicates that the prevailing wage rate for the occupation equals or exceeds \$27.63 per hour conformances may be necessary for certain nonexempt employees. - (1) The application of systems analysis techniques and procedures including consulting with users to determine hardware software or system functional specifications;
- (2) The design development documentation analysis creation testing or modification of computer systems or programs including prototypes based on and related to user or system design specifications;
- (3) The design documentation testing creation or modification of computer programs related to machine operating systems; or
- (4) A combination of the aforementioned duties the performance of which requires the same level of skills. (29 C.F.R. 541.400).
- 2) AIR TRAFFIC CONTROLLERS AND WEATHER OBSERVERS NIGHT PAY & SUNDAY PAY: If you work at night as part of a regular tour of duty you will earn a night differential and receive an additional 10% of basic pay for any hours worked between 6pm and 6am. If you are a full-time employed (40 hours a week) and Sunday is part of your

regularly scheduled workweek you are paid at your rate of basic pay plus a Sunday premium of 25% of your basic rate for each hour of Sunday work which is not overtime (i.e. occasional work on Sunday outside the normal tour of duty is considered overtime work).

** HAZARDOUS PAY DIFFERENTIAL **

An 8 percent differential is applicable to employees employed in a position that represents a high degree of hazard when working with or in close proximity to ordnance explosives and incendiary materials. This includes work such as screening blending dying mixing and pressing of sensitive ordnance explosives and pyrotechnic compositions such as lead azide black powder and photoflash powder. All dry-house activities involving propellants or explosives. Demilitarization modification renovation demolition and maintenance operations on sensitive ordnance explosives and incendiary materials. All operations involving re-grading and cleaning of artillery ranges.

A 4 percent differential is applicable to employees employed in a position that represents a low degree of hazard when working with or in close proximity to ordnance (or employees possibly adjacent to) explosives and incendiary materials which involves potential injury such as laceration of hands face or arms of the employee engaged in the operation irritation of the skin minor burns and the like; minimal damage to immediate or adjacent work area or equipment being used. All operations involving unloading storage and hauling of ordnance explosive and incendiary ordnance material other than small arms ammunition. These differentials are only applicable to work that has been specifically designated by the agency for ordnance explosives and incendiary material differential pay.

** UNIFORM ALLOWANCE **

If employees are required to wear uniforms in the performance of this contract (either by the terms of the Government contract by the employer by the state or local law etc.) the cost of furnishing such uniforms and maintaining (by laundering or dry cleaning) such uniforms is an expense that may not be borne by an employee where such cost reduces the hourly rate below that required by the wage determination. The Department of Labor will accept payment in accordance with the following standards as compliance:

The contractor or subcontractor is required to furnish all employees with an adequate number of uniforms without cost or to reimburse employees for the actual cost of the uniforms. In addition where uniform cleaning and maintenance is made the responsibility of the employee all contractors and subcontractors subject to this wage determination shall (in the absence of a bona fide collective bargaining agreement providing for a different amount or the furnishing of contrary affirmative proof as to the actual cost) reimburse all employees for such cleaning and maintenance at a rate of \$3.35 per week (or \$.67 cents per day). However in those instances where the uniforms furnished are made of ""wash and wear"" materials may be routinely washed and dried with other personal garments and do not require any special treatment such as dry cleaning daily washing or commercial laundering in order to meet the cleanliness or appearance standards set by the terms of the Government contract by the contractor by law or by the nature of the work there is no requirement that employees be reimbursed for uniform maintenance costs.

** REQUEST FOR AUTHORIZATION OF ADDITIONAL CLASSIFICATION AND WAGE RATE Standard Form 1444 (SF-1444) **

Conformance Process:

The contracting officer shall require that any class of service employee which is not listed herein and which is to be employed under the contract (i.e. the work to be performed is not performed by any classification listed in the wage determination) be classified by the contractor so as to provide a reasonable relationship (i.e. appropriate level of skill comparison) between such unlisted classifications and the classifications listed in the wage determination (See 29 CFR 4.6(b)(2)(i)). Such conforming procedures shall be initiated by the contractor prior to the performance of contract work by such unlisted class(es) of employees (See 29 CFR 4.6(b)(2)(ii)). The Wage and Hour Division shall make a final determination of conformed classification wage rate and/or fringe benefits which shall be paid to all employees performing in the classification from the first day of work on which contract work is performed by them in the classification. Failure to pay such unlisted employees the compensation agreed upon by the interested parties and/or fully determined by the Wage and Hour Division retroactive to the date such class of employees commenced contract work shall be a violation of the Act and this contract. (See 29 CFR 4.6(b)(2)(v)). When multiple wage determinations are included in a contract a separate SF-1444 should be prepared for each wage determination to which a class(es) is to be conformed.

The process for preparing a conformance request is as follows:

- 1) When preparing the bid the contractor identifies the need for a conformed occupation(s) and computes a proposed rate(s).
- 2) After contract award the contractor prepares a written report listing in order the proposed classification title(s) a Federal grade equivalency (FGE) for each proposed classification(s) job description(s) and rationale for proposed wage rate(s) including information regarding the agreement or disagreement of the authorized representative of the employees involved or where there is no authorized representative the employees themselves. This report should be submitted to the contracting officer no later than 30 days after such unlisted class(es) of employees performs any contract work.
- 3) The contracting officer reviews the proposed action and promptly submits a report of the action together with the agency's recommendations and pertinent information including the position of the contractor and the employees to the U.S. Department of Labor Wage and Hour Division for review (See 29 CFR 4.6(b)(2)(ii)).
- 4) Within 30 days of receipt the Wage and Hour Division approves modifies or disapproves the action via transmittal to the agency contracting officer or notifies the contracting officer that additional time will be required to process the request.
- 5) The contracting officer transmits the Wage and Hour Division's decision to the contractor.

6) Each affected employee shall be furnished by the contractor with a written copy of such determination or it shall be posted as a part of the wage determination (See 29 CFR 4.6(b)(2)(iii)).

Information required by the Regulations must be submitted on SF-1444 or bond paper.

When preparing a conformance request the ""Service Contract Act Directory of Occupations"" should be used to compare job definitions to ensure that duties requested are not performed by a classification already listed in the wage determination. Remember it is not the job title but the required tasks that determine whether a class is included in an established wage determination. Conformances may not be used to artificially split combine or subdivide classifications listed in the wage determination (See 29 CFR 4.152(c)(1))."




FIGURE NO 1: Boundary Clearing Specifications





FIGURE NO 2: Boundary Marking Specifications
