## **Visitor Services Specialist:**

Greet and orientate visitors, answer questions about the Cape Cod Canal and the local area, answer phones, keep track of visitation numbers, stock brochure racks, operate a cash register for a small bookstore in the Visitor Center, and assist in the daily upkeep and operations of the Visitor Center (all while soaking in amazing views of the Canal!) Morning and afternoon shifts are available. Each shift is 4 hours. The Visitor Center is open to the public daily, May 1–Oct. 28 from 10am-5pm. 4 hours a week is requested.

## **Interpretive Program Volunteer:**

Perfect opportunities for local college students, retired teachers, or anyone who wants to share their love of lifelong learning!

In May and June: Work with Park Rangers to host 3<sup>rd</sup> & 4<sup>th</sup> grade field trips at the Cape Cod Canal Visitor Center. Students explore the Cape Cod Canal's natural and engineered history, tides, navigational/recreational usage today, marine operations, and boating safety. Field trips usually occur Mondays through Fridays from 10am-12pm. Volunteer shifts run from 9:30am-12:30pm. 3 to 6 hours a week is requested. In July and August: Work with Park Rangers or independently to help lead a variety of interpretive programs offered to the general public throughout the summer.

Training is provided for all positions.
