

The region has 6,100 miles of coastline, 13 deep draft commercial waterways, 13 major river basins, and thousands of rivers and streams. Within this area of operation, USACE has completed hundreds of Civil Works projects that benefit the New England communities.

The missions of the New England District are many and varied. 


