Subject: Final 2023 Long Term Management Letter Report Former Cape Poge Little Neck Bomb Target Munitions Response Sites Martha's Vineyard, Massachusetts Contract No. W912DR22C0044

Section 1 Introduction

GSI North America Inc. (GSINA) under contract to the United States Army Corps of Engineers (USACE), Baltimore District as Contracting District and New England District as Project Management District, is performing long term management (LTM) of land use controls (LUCs) at the Land and Inland Water Munitions Response Sites (MRSs), located within the Former Cape Poge Little Neck Bomb Target Munitions Response Area, Martha's Vineyard, Massachusetts (MA). The Land MRS (Project 01) and Inland Water MRS (Project 02) are assigned to the Formerly Used Defense Sites (FUDS) Military Munitions Response Program (MMRP) under the FUDS Property Number D01MA0595.

1.1 Purpose and Scope

This annual LTM Report documents LTM activities performed at the Former Cape Poge Little Neck Bomb Target, Land, and Inland Water MRSs in accordance with the LUC Implementation Plan (LUCIP) (USACE, 2019) and Performance Work Statement for contract W912DR22C0044 entitled "Implement Land Use Controls and Five-Year Reviews for Various Sites Within Massachusetts" dated 24 August 2022. The annual activities outlined in the LUCIP include inspecting and maintaining unexploded ordnance (UXO) hazard awareness signs, conducting UXO awareness training sessions, distributing 3R's (recognize, retreat, and report) explosives safety educational materials, conducting interviews with local officials and property owners, and obtaining a summary of UXO related activity at the MRSs from the Unexploded Ordnance Detachment out of Quonset Point, the Massachusetts State Bomb Squad and/or Local Edgartown Police. These requirements are also presented as a checklist in Attachment F.

The annual LTM Reports will be submitted to the Massachusetts Department of Environmental Protection (MassDEP), The Trustees of Reservations (TTOR), and additional local stakeholders as needed for review and comment and will be included as an attachment to the Comprehensive Environmental Response, Compensation, and Liability Act Five-Year Review Reports.

Section 2 Sign Inspection and Maintenance

On 23 June 2023, a site visit was conducted by GSINA personnel Mr. Mark Sprouse and Mr. Larry deVries. Ms. Carol Ann Charette, USACE PM, also participated in the inspections to provide quality assurance oversight of the procedures being used. The purpose of the site visit was to inspect the condition of the signs installed on site and evaluate current site conditions including

indications of erosion, road conditions, any disturbances to ground surface, any munition items observed on the ground surface or along the shorelines, or eroding from the dunes, as well as any changes documented from previous years. The weather conditions were cloudy in the morning and sunny in the afternoon with a temperature of approximately 70 to 85 degrees Fahrenheit. Each sign, its location, and general vicinity were evaluated in terms of site conditions.

2.1 Sign Conditions

During the site visit, GSINA personnel inspected and cleaned the two signs, one installed at Dyke Bridge and the other at Little Neck. The team navigated to the signs using the locations provided in the LUCIP, shown on the Sign Location Figure in Attachment B. The locations of the signs were recorded during the field visit using hand-held global positioning system units. The signs (including the display surfaces, support posts, and frames) were generally noted in good condition. Signs were sprayed with CLR cleaner, the cleaner was allowed to sit 3-5 minutes, signs were then scrubbed with a stiff bristle brush, and then wiped dry with paper towels. The sign at the Dyke Bridge location had some chips in the display surface, though they did not obscure the text or images. This damage can be seen in the photo documentation log included in Attachment B. Overall, the area where the signs were installed was described as well maintained and a good location for the public to view the sign information. Sign recommendations are included in Section 6.

2.2 Site Conditions

Current site conditions were evaluated as part of the annual site inspection. GSINA personnel walked the areas of the beach in the vicinity of the signs and between the signs, assessing site conditions in terms of erosion and potential impacts to the proper functioning of the LUCs.

Site conditions are described relative to the location of the signage for easier geographical reference (see Sign Location Figure, Attachment B). Below is what was noted during the site visit:

- Southern portion of site: Area of Dyke Bridge Sign minimal to no indications of erosion; and
- Northern portion of site: Area of Little Neck Sign minimal signs of erosion in the overall northern portion of the area.

Overall, erosion has not impacted the proper functioning of the LUCs in terms of the signs remaining in place. The Little Neck sign in the northern portion of site is more subject to erosion and/or inundation at high tide than the sign at the Dyke Bridge but was relatively unchanged from the conditions noted in the 2020 LTM Report (ERT, 2020). No munitions or munitions-related debris were observed during the inspections.

GSINA/USACE queried the Town of Edgartown Building Department and TToR to determine whether major construction activities have occurred in the past year (June 2022 to June 2023) within the MRSs that impacted the functioning of the LUCs and LTM program. The Building Department responded that no building permits were issued for locations within the site boundaries. TToR responded that no construction has occurred within the site boundaries in the past year. During the site walk, GSINA did not observe any indications of construction or intrusive activities, or indications that additional LUCs, such as signage, were required.

Section 3 UXO Awareness Training

UXO awareness training was held on 26 June 2023. The training was conducted in person at the Old Whaling Church in Edgartown on Martha's Vineyard as well as virtually through the Microsoft Teams application. The PowerPoint presentation generated by GSINA was approved by USACE in June 2023. The training included general 3Rs (Recognize, Retreat, Report) practices as well as site specific information for all Martha's Vineyard MMRP sites (including South Beach Moving Target Machine Gun and Katama Rocket Range MRS, Former Cape Poge Little Neck Bomb Target MRSs, and Tisbury Great Pond MRSs).

All parties listed in the LUCIP distribution list (Table 3-1 of the LUCIP [USACE, 2019]) were invited to the training, including MassDEP, TToR, and first responders (local police and fire department personnel). The in-person and virtual attendees were recorded on a sign-in sheet (Attachment A). Several parties could not attend the presentation in person and will be sent a link to a training video once approved by USACE. Site-specific educational materials were handed out to the in-person training attendees. All parties listed in Table 3-1 of the LUCIP who did not attend the in-person training were contacted and chose to receive the educational materials digitally rather than through the mail. These digital submittals were included with the correspondence discussed in Section 4.

Section 4 Annual Community Survey Questionnaires

A requirement of the LUCIP was to conduct interviews with stakeholders and community members about the site conditions. GSINA used questionnaire forms to conduct interviews via phone and email and used the Interview Call List to track progress. The responses received and tracking sheet are presented in Attachment D. Contact information for the parties was obtained from Table 3-1 in the LUCIP (USACE, 2019). The responses to the questionnaires did not indicate that changes were needed to the LTM measures in place. GSINA confirmed during the site walk that there had been no changes to site use.

Section 5 EOD Activity

Local Police/Fire Departments as well as the MA State Police Bomb Squad and Navy Explosive Ordnance Disposal (EOD), were contacted regarding any incidents that had occurred on site within the previous year. No ordnance incidents were reported within the previous year (June 2022 to June 2023).

Note, USACE continues to attempt to obtain all EOD reports for all projects currently undergoing LUCs. Unfortunately obtaining complete reports or any report at all has been an ongoing challenge as EOD reports are not produced for all EOD responses. A contact with the Navy EOD informed GSINA that obtaining formal EOD response reports now requires a Freedom of Information Act Request. Reports that are provided are usually inadequate as well, and often do not provide specific information such as the site/project name and/or grid coordinates of the location of the munition response. Our requests and the challenge of obtaining all reports with complete information has been elevated up the USACE chain of command; if and when these EOD reports are obtained, they will be provided.

Section 6 Recommendations

No issues were noted during the inspection of the two signs installed at the site. The signs and support posts were found to be in good condition and the location was favorable for public viewing. Some erosion of the beach near the Little Neck sign location was mentioned in the site inspection form (Attachment C). Table 6-1 below summarizes the recommendations for each sign location.

Sign Location	Recommendations
Dike Bridge	Metal frames and posts on signs should eventually be replaced with composite material.
Little Neck	Metal frames and posts on signs should eventually be replaced with composite material.

 Table 6-1: Sign Recommendation Summary

GSINA recommends that the metal frames and posts on these signs eventually be replaced with composite material that will require less frequent maintenance. The maritime conditions of the site will mean continued rust of the current metallic supports resulting in jagged edges or structural weakness. Using composite materials for the frame and support posts would make them more durable and increase the time between necessary repair or replacement of the signs. Sign location recommendations are also noted on the Sign Recommendations figure (Attachment B).

Additionally, GSINA also recommends that Table 3-1, Distribution Recipients, in the LUCIP be updated to reflect the current contacts for local authorities, first responders, property owners, and others.




Sign Location Figure



Yes, I am aware of the project. My overall impression is that USACE did a thorough job with the investigation and remediation of the MEC and MD. It is my understanding that the site restoration activities remain ongoing.

2. Are you aware of any community concerns regarding the site or its operation and administration? If so, please give details.

I have not received any inquiries regarding the site and am not aware of any community concerns currently.

3. Do you feel well informed about the site's activities and progress?

No, I do not. I am not aware of current activities or "progress". I have not received any information regarding the site in over a year. I am unsure of the status the restoration activities and bittersweet treatment as well as the ESD and LUCIP. The last communication MassDEP has received regarding site updates was May 2022.

4. Have you talked with any U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, state, or environmental officials about the ongoing FUDS LTM at the Former Cape Poge Little Neck Bomb Target MRSs? If you have, were they responsive to your concerns or questions?

I have not spoken to USACE regarding the FUDS LTM. My understanding of the project from the last update I received was that USACE was to prepare an ESD and updated LUCIP. I have not received any updates since May 2022.
