Section 1002 of the Water Resources Reform and Development Act (WRRDA) allows for greater transparency in the notification and reporting of feasibility study milestones. WRRDA Section 1002 requires the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers District Engineer to provide non-Federal interests a notification of feasibility study milestone schedules for all active studies that received Investigation appropriations since October 1, 2009 until June 10, 2014. Studies initiated after June 10, 2014 also require notification of five key milestones within 90 days of signing the Feasibility Cost Sharing Agreement. Section 1002 further requires notification if milestone dates are not met.

On May 25, 2016, we provided the following study schedule for the Pawcatuck River & Rhode Island Coastal Investigation Feasibility Study:

District Submittal of the Final Feasibility Report
MSC Transmittal of the Final Feasibility Report
Civil Works Review Board
Signed Chief's Report

However, due to the additional time needed to review the draft report and address all comments, completion of the Final Feasibility Report scheduled for March 31, 2017 will be delayed until August 25, 2017. The remaining scheduled milestone dates will be similarly delayed. This letter provides formal notification of the change in schedule. The new schedule is now as follows:
